

ST. LOUIS WINS THE GAME 4-0

RESCUE CORPS IN COAL MINE LABORS NOBLY

Comrades of Victims Are Braving Poison Gas to Reach Stricken Miners; Have No Idea Any of Men Escaped With Life.

ROCKWOOD, Tenn., Oct. 5.—The comrades of 23 miners, believed dead in the wrecked Rector iron country's coal mine, braved poison gas at the risk of their lives today to reach the victims.

Federal mine inspection officials said it was hardly possible that any of the men in the mine at the time of the explosion yesterday could be alive.

Gathered about the foot of the great bluff into which the Rector company has driven its mine for more than three miles, were the families of the victims.

The rescue crews, working ceaselessly, were weary and dejected by gas. They disregarded the orders of cautious officials and searched the mine despite the menace of black fumes.

Besides the 23 victims, four other miners were injured, two critically. No one is missing.

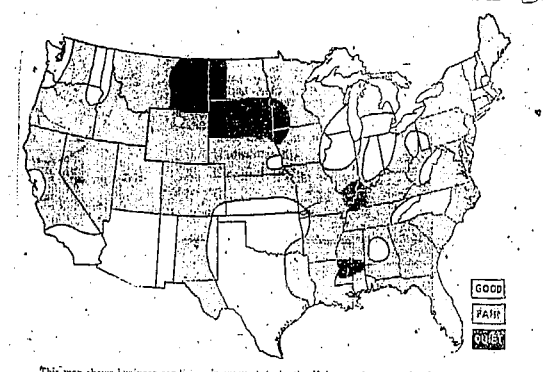
Many of the victims were killed outright, while the others succumbed to the deadly atmosphere.

Of the men who lived to tell of the tragedy, two owe their lives to the heroic efforts of the rescue corps on the day shift which was almost wiped out.

Cook and two companions outside the tunnel at the time of the explosion fought their way back into the gas filled mine and dragged the unconscious men to safety.

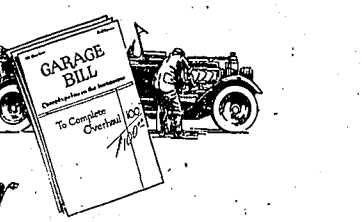

WHEN TO CUT FOR SUCCULENT SILAGE

Almost any forage crop has all the chemical requirements to make a good silage. The only requirement, therefore, says the United States Department of Agriculture, for a silage to be cut for silage is to cut it when the moisture content is too high the silage will be waterlogged and the soluble carbohydrates will be lost to the soil. If the moisture content is too low and water is not added, the silage will not be succulent and will not pack well enough to prevent the inflow of air and the growth of mold. This general conclusion is the result of experiments conducted in the laboratory by chemists of the bureau of dairying in which corn, sorghum and sudan grass, alfalfa and lucerne and tuck 2 feet in diameter and 4 feet deep. The investigations included a study of the chemical composition, keeping quality, changes during fermentation, and losses in feed materials while in the laboratory. For cuts in the laboratory, silage was cut at different stages of maturity—(1) when 20 percent of the ears were in the dough stage and 80 per cent in the milk stage, (2) when 40 per cent in dough and 60 per cent in milk, (3) when 60 per cent were in dough and 40 per cent in milk, and (4) when 80 per cent in dough and 20 per cent in milk. Study of the resulting silage showed the fourth stage to be the best for use in silage. At this stage there was the least loss of feed constituents in the silage. This fact, coupled with the good results made when the fourth stage silage was packed, indicated that the best corn silage results if cut when the best time is cut when 80 per cent in dough and 20 per cent in the milk stage.
