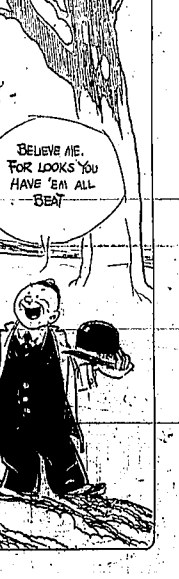

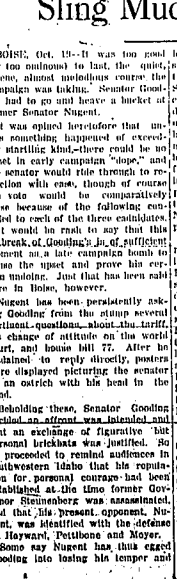

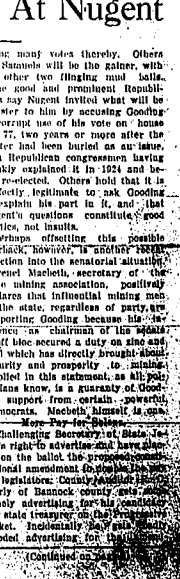

## MIDGET-MINDS IN LEGISLATURES

The following comes from an eminent judge in Mississippi and is reproduced herewith for what it is worth and with no intention of offending anyone in Idaho. It is taken from an extract of an opinion in the *Crippen vs. Mint Sales Company* (Miss.) 103 Southern Reporter, 503:

"Independent of jurisdiction, it would be a dangerous undertaking for the court, if it had the power, to undertake the job of correcting legislative mistakes and follies, for there is much in the statutes of the past dozen years evidencing midget-minded statesmen and much of folly. Still I am not disposed to be hard on the legislators. Taken as a whole it does good work and eliminates many unwise measures. There are men in the legislature who could fill any station in the government with credit, and the majority would class as 'average and better.' But there are usually some 35 per cent to 40 per cent of the membership who only excuse for being sent to the legislature is to keep them out of the race for constables and justices of the peace. These men have votes, and have to be reckoned with by the wise ones in shaping the legislation of the session. If you antagonize their bills, they strike back. They are strong on midget legislation, and when they introduce a bill to place jay birds under peace bonds, or to muzzle seed ticks, or to prohibit vending machines in stores, the wise ones will vote with them for the sake of more important measures coming on. None of these pigmy statesmen go after large questions and undertake their solution; they attack small tasks. They are strong on moral questions, or something that sounds well, which they can take back home to their people for home consumption in future politics. They go around with a spiritual microscope, searching for the germs of evil in trifles, while utterly ignoring the mountains of iniquity which stand out in plain view in the nearby landscape. Instead of making war on the beasts and birds of prey that menace society, they hunt for earthworms. Conscious of their inability to deal with large matters, they make a record from trifles, garbed in high-sounding phrases."

## SOIL FERTILITY FROM THE AIR

BY NEWTON HIBBS

The major trust vouchsafed the "birds of creation" is the utilization of available natural elements of soil fertility for the perpetuation of life. Every barren field is a monument of inexcusable human ignorance. All elements of plant life are ever present in the atmosphere of every temperate and tropic climatic zone. It is the sum of agricultural science to nourish the crops of the field from the inexhaustible and abundant minerals of the air. The real mineral atoms of the atmosphere are the exclusive plant foods.

There are wild dreams of the conquest of the air, like the Muscle Shoals power plant, to revert aerial minerals by mechanical energy to earthly nitrate form. These are inconsistent dreams ridiculous in impotency. These minerals of the air are refined plant food made aerial in Nature's laboratory. To revert these atmospheric elements, by mechanical means, to earthly mineral atoms—over-nitric acid—makes them unavailable for reasonable plant nourishment. In the scheme of plant creation, and perpetuation by nourishment, minerals are ingested, digested and excreted by animate organisms.

Crude minerals applied to soils breed animate organisms but only minerals subjected to transformation by oxidation and bacterial digestion are available for seasonal plant food. Crude minerals unavailably incorporated in cultivated soils destroy the fertility bacteria and breed disease spores which destroy fertility organisms. Soil sterility is the result of predominance of disease organisms over fertility bacteria. Soil sterility does not occur in nature; but it is the result of man's erroneous tillage methods. Virgin soils are ever rich in plant food before they are ravished by man. The deserts have desiccated crystals of conserved fertility for the scientific farmer. Then comes the crude minerals of alkali death spores to destroy the valuable bacteria.

A barren clod may be freed from all sterility disease spores in the laboratory. It may then be reseeded by fertility bacteria and made fertile by simple atmospheric exposure; in the course of but a few days. Fertile soil may be made from rocks by chemical, mechanical and atmospheric action without the lapse of time. All these are accomplished by nature in the course of ages—barren fields are being made prolific by natural law. Man depleted these fields—while every element of fertility was perpetually available. We hear much about wasted fertility. Fertility is animate and inanimate life perpetually present, and available like all other atoms of matter, indestructible. All material atoms of fertility are wafted over every acre every day, only waiting for intelligent soil tillage and available amendments. Sterility is an effect of animate pests imported and propagated by the farmer. The lessons of the laboratory should become common knowledge to eradicate common prejudices.

**Held by Gravity**  
The atmosphere is just such a part of the earth as the soil. It is held in its relative position by the same force—gravity. It is not swept off because there is no air to sweep it. There is nothing to spare to hold it back—nothing.
