IDAHO APPLES ARE IN DEMAND

Growth of Industry Is Shown by Comparison with Earlier Years in the Gem State.

The Idaho apple crop of 1936, which was shipped from the 27 principal orchards in the United States, according to a report received today by U. S. Department of Agriculture, is the largest apple crop ever produced in the United States. The balance of the crop was also a record for the United States. The report also disclosed that Idaho apples are demanded a higher figure for the previous year. The demand for Idaho apples in the Rocky Mountain and Pacific states, now the largest apple producing section in the United States.

NOTE:

Apple production in these states has grown from 25 per cent of the United States crop in 1914-1925 to 32 per cent in the period of 1926-1935. Of Idaho shipments to principal cities, 41 cars were sent to Los Angeles, 35 to Kansas City and 25 to Chicago. Idaho supplied 23 per cent of New York's demand last year and 84 per cent of the state's apple needs. The average New York price was \$17 per box, while Idaho paid an average of \$16.7.
