HURRICANE
KILLS MANY
ON ISLAND

Isle of Pines Death List
Mounts to 327 According
to Latest Estimates From
Stricken Area; 285 Perish
in Neighborhood of Ha-
vana.

HAVANA, Oct. 23.—The death list resulting from Wednesday's hurricane was unofficially increased to 327 today, with the Isle of Pines and Batambao, a southern coast port, contributing 12 of the fatalities. The remaining 265 were killed in Havana or the nearby areas.

Twelve bodies were recovered from the bay today.

President Machado announced that Havana would be rehabilitated in a month except for the injured trees.

SHORTAGE OF
POTATOES IS
NOW FEARED

Horticulturist States That Crop
Has Diminished a Million Bushels;
Idaho Crop Is About 80
Per Cent of Normal.

BOSTON, Oct. 23.—It appears
to be more to market in the
state than they are doing, a nation-
wide shortage will develop before the
first of the year, C. R. Bunting, field
representative of the University of
Illinois extension, told a meeting of
horticulturists in Boston yesterday. He
had returned from an extensive tour
through the state and reported that,
while the crop is up in New England
and elsewhere, it is excellent in the case
of Idaho, where there is a million
bushels from which can be drawn
the best couch.

Reports show average shipments
over the country of 1200 cars
each week, while Mr. Bunting said
this compares with a normal quota
during the marketing season of about
2000 cars daily. In spite of this heavy
movement, the price is holding up
with the fact that growing slightly
less each week, and that dealers
foreseeing a shortage are becoming
more anxious.

"The bulk of the movement is from
eastern states, particularly Maine and
Michigan, while Idaho is shipped
mainly to the western markets. The
price of Idaho potatoes, providing frost
damage is not too extreme in the
potatoe short, should yield good re-
sults next year when the entire country
will be back in the fall and can be
drawn heavily into the market, the
price was strongest in the fall, but
a temporary shortage was thus
created. But when the potatoe is
marketed toward the end of the season
there is not much frost damage, and
then the market could absorb, and
some odd at prices as at 21.

"It looks as though the contrary,
affid, will hold this year. It is my
opinion that there is a lack of con-

quality, and in fact I believe we will
have a short crop of good quality
potatoes this year, holding from

prices from 67 cents in 1925 to 82 cents

GOODING RESPONSIBLE FOR H. B. 77

BY JAMES D. WHALEAN.

Comes now Senator Frank R. Gooding personally and by Governor C. C. Moore, and says that he always opposed house Bill No. 77; and that this opposition led him to ask President Harding to veto the bill.

Unfortunately for these gentlemen there were daily papers published in Boise in February, 1922, and both, though republican, published very fair stories of the great mass meeting at which this bill was denounced by hundreds of sheepmen and settlers. Gooding's connection was amply shown in that meeting and in letters by republican officials thereafter.

Quoting Scott Anderson from the Statesman:

"Mr. Anderson then told of having received a letter from Senator Frank R. Gooding, who said he understood stockmen generally were behind the measure and thought it the proper step to insure better range conditions in the state. 'How many of you stockmen knew anything about this bill prior to the time it was finally passed?' asked Mr. Anderson of the audience. 'Stand up, please.' 'No one stood.'

Why none of the men whom Frank Gooding declared were behind it stood up is made clear by Mr. Anderson, according to the Capital News, which says:

"Mr. Anderson also claimed that those interested in the promotion of the bill promised to give him any amount of land he wanted later if he would keep quiet about it. He said that those behind the bill did not want any publicity on it as they felt that such would result in opposition among dry land farmers of the state." In other words it was a job put up by Fred W. Gooding and two pals, whom Gooding assumed were the stockmen of the state.

J. E. Clinton, associate of Fred Gooding in the deal also affirmed that all four members of the Idaho delegation including Senator Gooding favored the bill. His is reported as follows:

"Idaho is represented in Congress," said J. E. Clinton, the next speaker, "by two senators and two congressmen, and this measure, with all of its merits and demerits, has succeeded in successfully running the gauntlet of these four since its introduction." The investigation proceeding now has unearthed nothing new and nothing not now in possession of the Idaho delegation.

Here is Fred W. Gooding's version given at the same protest meeting showing that he conferred with Senator Gooding, who at first protested but was finally convinced that it was a good thing.

"We then said we would see what we could do in congress. Mr. Penn and I went to Washington and I talked to Frank Gooding about it. Frank at first went right up in the air and thought it was a hand grab, but after we had explained thoroughly he said:

"If you do that you must include everybody in the state. He added that if we would divide the holdings among the livestock men of the state he thought it would be a good thing and would support it. He said there probably would be some opposition at the outset but in the last analysis it would be considered a good thing."

Miles Cannon, republican commissioner of agriculture, charged insincerity which implicated Senator Gooding. He said:

"Moreover, the insincerity of these gentlemen is made manifest by the fact that Crawford More submitted to Senator Gooding a plan of distribution of this script to all stockmen share and share alike and in such proportions as would be equitable to the number of stock owned by all citizens, which proposition was immediately and emphatically denied."

Lastly there is a purported interview of Senator Gooding from the Capital News in which among other things, the senator is quoted as saying:

"I have given this bill careful consideration and regard it for the best interests of Idaho. It was carefully studied by the entire Idaho delegation and approved by all."


