If you have never taken your pencil and figured out just how much money is sent from here annually on account of the gas tax it is high time that you were making this mathematical calculation. Twin Falls county last year sent to the State Highway Commission in the neighborhood of \$100,000 as a special tax levied upon gasoline sold here. But on the other hand the State Highway Commission, into whose hands this money goes, spent here during the last year only about \$1400, in other, words they took \$86,000 and used it either in overhead for the State Road Commission or else diverted it to some other county in this great state. Whichever one of these means was used for disposing of our good cash, we claim it was little less than stealing from Twin Falls county about \$86,000 which was supposed to have been used to improve the state highways in south Idaho.

Now just as long as the present law prevails this steal will continue and just that long we are not going to get our just deserts in road construction for the good cash which we assess ourselves. Just that long will we feel like our state government is not being run for the masses, but instead for the classes, and this happens to be fast now the G. O. P. ring. The character and career of Lincoln both appeal. In practical politics a Whig and a Republican, he was in underlying principles a Jefferson Democrat. His Republican biographer, Judge Wannanker, points out that all his fundamental utterances, including every paragraph in the famous Gettysburg speech, were directly based on the Declaration of Independence or other Jeffersonian pronouncements. On the other hand, his tariff and bank views insofar as we can judge either, were Whig and Republican. But, as Becker very well points out, in his "Declaration of Independence," while Jefferson was always a philosopher and appealed to the heart through the heart, Becker does not say so, but perhaps this accounts for their fundamentally different attitudes on the tariff. Anyhow it arouses universal friendly feeling for Lincoln. But while Lincoln differed from the democrats on the tariff and on-money, these questions were largely relegated during most of his cyeer by the universal adoption of the democratic view. It seems passing strange "that though his great, vival, Douglas, took a rather, extreme Democratic slant on the tariff when he discussed it at all, the issue was not even considered in the famous debates. This lack of controversy over a hone of contention between the parties resulted in leaving no mental inhibition among Democrats to prevent full recognition's claim to greatness.

The broad humanity, the tolerance, the homely wit, common sense and underlying melancholy of Lincoln make him an appealing figure in all circles.

So far as his fame is concerned, the circumstances surrounding his death tended not only to enhance it, but to gain for it speedy and universal recognition, Singularly the conditions existing, and the events preceding and following the demise of Douglas, tended to observe unduly the reputation of the champion of Democracy, The storm of intolerance inside the cabinet

was its best friend, and roused in his memory the chivalry below the Mason and Dixon line. On the other hand. Douglas died before his cloquent Union speeches had sunk in permanently on the northern mind and these were forgotten in the years that followed; while his break with the South over the Kansas question left him without defenders there. Hence, as pointed out by Howland, while the contemporaries of Douglas regarded him as the equal of Webster, Clay, Benton and Calhoun, the present generation lates him on a lower seale. But the star of Line eration places him on a lower scale. But the star of Lin-coln rose steadily and has not been eclipsed. Every incident connected with the life of Lincoln has a human interest that holds the attention of men in wide


