

JAPAN WILL SUPPORT U. S. PEACE

France and Italy Will Perhaps Oppose President's Plan of Disarmament on Grounds That Whole Armaments Problem Are Linked Together.

TOKIO, Feb. 11.—Afternoon newspapers were in substantial agreement here today that Japan would accept President Coolidge's disarmament conference proposal but would not favor limitation of cruisers on a 5-5-3 basis.

The "forbidden" office, while refusing to express a definite attitude, said Japan will be found ready to participate in the proposed disarmament conference.

A spokesman for the naval office pointed out that Japan, France and Italy had already subscribed to the resolution of the Geneva experts regarding naval limitations on a basis of total tonnage and without limiting the Coolidge proposal.

GENEVA, Feb. 11.—League of Nations spokesman today gave detailed account of President Coolidge's suggestion that limitation of naval armament be extended from capital ships to auxiliary cruisers—cruisers, destroyers and submarines.

The United Press was informed at the secretariat that the league sought disarmament from whatever direction it came.

Both of the success of Mr. Coolidge's proposals was explained as having been based on the following reasons:

Lord Cecil, representing Britain at Geneva, definitely announced that no outside disarmament proposal could be considered until the league's disarmament conference had finished its work because of the necessity for concentrating on the work in hand.

France and Italy, throughout the league's preliminary discussion of disarmament, instead of assisting that naval disarmament, was intrinsically proper and could not be treated separately.

Britain's plan, however, was attached to the fact that the British policy had not changed since the Washington conference of 1922. It would be the same, the spokesman said, if it were announced at that time by Lord Halifax.

The attitude of the government was that anything giving an impetus to the cause of disarmament would be "all to the good for the peace of the world."

The British press, however, was disappointed in the information regarding the suggestion. News of it was strikingly subordinated in today's papers, although the memorandum delivered by President Coolidge to the league's disarmament conference had been available since yesterday afternoon.

Considerable significance was attached to the fact that the leading conservative newspapers relegated Mr. Coolidge's proposals to their preliminary news papers.

LINCOLN GIANT AMONG BIG MEN

BY JAMES D. WHELAN.

Various reasons enter into the growing Lincoln sentiment in this country, which makes William E. Barton declare him to be the best beloved American, and Carl Sandberg to assert that his is the most traced character in American history.

The character and career of Lincoln both appeal. In practical politics a Whig and a Republican, he was in underlying principles a Jefferson Democrat. His Republican biographer, Judge Wamamaker, points out that all his fundamental utterances, including every paragraph in the famous Gettysburg speech, were directly based on the Declaration of Independence or other Jeffersonian pronouncements.

But while Lincoln differed from the democrats on the tariff and on money, these questions were largely relegated during most of his career by the universal adoption of the democratic view. It seems passing strange that though his great rival, Douglas, took a rather extreme Democratic slant on the tariff when he discussed it at all, the issue was not even considered in the famous debates.

The broad humanity, the tolerance, the homely wit, common sense and underlying melancholy of Lincoln make him an appealing figure in all circles.

So far as his fame is concerned, the circumstances surrounding his death tended not only to enhance it, but to gain for it speedy and universal recognition, singularly the conditions existing, and the events preceding and following the demise of Douglas, tended to obscure unduly the reputation of the champion of Democracy.

The storm of intolerance inside the cabinet and in congress which crushed his successor and the heir to his policies would have left its mark on Lincoln history; and while time would have vindicated his views, the vindication would not have been so speedy or so sure, had he lived through the reconstruction era. The liberal policy which he advocated made the south realize that Lincoln was his best friend, and roused in his memory the chivalry below the Mason and Dixon line.

Every incident connected with the life of Lincoln has a human interest that holds the attention of men in wide circles. Panegyrists of the school of Ida Tarbell, who in honest-but mistaken adulation adopt the policy of trying to enhance the stature of Lincoln by picturing his contemporaries as pygmies are doing him an injustice.
