No objection is raised to this statement, but as the saying goes, it is not always a good idea to, draw com-parisons. Abraham Lincoln handled a most difficult national problem in what is generally considered the most statesmanlike fashion that such a question has ever been handled. While this problem of slavery was not altogether a national one, because at that time it did not affect materially the other nations of the world. But Wilson, on the office hand, had to settle grave national problems and very vexing international problems as well. He was besieged by greater national problems as well. He was besieged by greater national problems han Abraham Lincoln because the American people had advanced much farther up the scale of civilization at his age than had it done at the age in which Lincoln sat in the White House. The higher the civilization of any nation the greater the complexity of the problems of that government. Therefore, the two ages are not to be compared when national issues are at state. But compled with these great national issues came perplexing world problems. The most powerful nations of the universe were battling for supremacy, and America stood aloof and allowed others to almost insult her flag, her citizens sent to the depluts of a cold and heartless ocean before that mighty premier of all ages would declare "The U.S. must fight." It does not take a master mind or anything like an intricate thinking machine to deduct the conclusions which naturally fall in such a crisis.

Lincoln was undoubtedly the greatest expositor of
his day of the principles of human rights as set forth by
Thômas Jefferson, just as Woodrow Wilson was the great
est expositor of the same principles in the present genera
tion. But Wilson extended to the whole world what Lin
coll confined to his own country.

It is not our wish to belittle or becloud the great prob
lems which confronted the Great Emancipator, but when
these are compared with the gigantic issues that fronted
the mighty Wilson they mell like snow before a summer
sun. That Abraham Lincoln, was a giant in his day is a
truth which does not require proof or even argument hu
when a speaker says that he is-greater than all the sage
of the world he is assuming a latitude which reaches far
ther than most orators are willing to venture.

Wilson was criticised for not urging war sooner, jussay Washington and Adams were censured for not urging
declaration of war on France, and Jeffeison and Madison
were attacked for not asking congress to declare war or
England years before the struggle of 1912. Wilson had
in mind as his speeches in 1915 and 1916, and the private
diary of Colonel House reveal, the settlement of the
European struggle in a way that would prevent any great
despotism from triumphing. These diary entries, also
show that even the British foreign office at that time fened that complete defeat of German would mean the elevation of the despotism of the Russian ezar. The Russian

After victory came Wilson, in the face of abuse, misrepresentation and misunderstanding at home, and ophosidon of the old style diplomats abroad, adhered to


