lands in the upper Snake river valley by creating a surplus
water supply of water in a reservoir site that happens to
be within the boundaries of the Yellowstone park, but
which is not a sightseeing spot for tourists.

This is the Fall river basin, a large meadow section,
grown largely to sait grass, more or less soggy and some
swamp. The construction of a dam would impound in
this basin water that can be put to beneficial use on Idaho
lands. The park will not be injured. Much good will be
done by conserving water now going to waste.


