The big idea is that the farmer should buy Ford tractors, get his year's work done in a jiffy and then ride around in pleasant leisure in Ford touring cars for the rest of the year.

Henry is not the first wealthy man to spend a lot of money showing the farmers the "efficiency route" to ease leisure and fortune. But if he should make the venture? success his will be a unique demonstration.

Efficiency farms managed by men-of-great wealth are interesting and frequently are heneficial to agriculture in general. But almost never are they profitable to the gentlemen engaged in the undertaking.—Exchange.

Their researches shower that toward the end of the morning hours, immediately after lunch and toward the close of the working day that the continued application to machine or desk work produce a heavy fatigue.

It was during these periods of mental and physical laxity that the workers automatically slowed up their efforts. In many cases the fatigue produced a "blind spot that often led to factory accidents, to personnel and material. These two factors, together with the Jessened resistance to diseases such as colds, influenza, grippe, madheny inroads on the production sheets of large plants.

Consequently it now is accepted as a feature of effective management to relieve the fatigue of workers by sending apprentices or office boys among them with tray-loaded with fresh, cold water at least three times a day, fis realized that the toilers in plants and offices will no yountarily absent themselves from their desks or machines to take this refreshment systematically so it has been deemed expedient to serve them at their labor.

Two factors are regarded as essential in this matter of water service; that the water be pure and that it be dispensed without the danger of disease spread. 
