"The poor we have with us always," the Statesman says in its editorial Thursday against establishment of a tuberculosis hospital. This, will certainly continue if we do nothing to curb tuberculosis, for it is acknowledged to be the greatest known cause of poverty and dependency in the world today.

The Statesman also admits we have tuberculosis in Idaho—"Plenty of sufferers in the state, yet." That's a fortunate admission, isn't it? Conservative estimates of the economic cost to any community, for each death from tuberculosis has been placed at \$7,500. Simple computation will show that in Idaho with an average of 177 deaths a year from tuberculosis, the state is losing \$1,327,500. In a sense this is an unconscious loss because it comes out of so many sources and in amounts varying from a few mills in taxes for support of charitable "enterprises to hundreds of dollars from fraternal organizations, the churches, philamthropic agencies, etc. It is the average man and woman in Idaho that helps to support these enterprises, and thereby pay vicariously and out of all proportion. The sad part of it is that such help is temporary, unorganized, and not of a constructive character. Idaho should make some attemnt to control its enormous loss of lives and moneys due to tuberculosis. All of the people of the state can provide this care at a very small cost.
