

The \$50,000 Idaho advertising fund, to be expended The \$50,000 Idaho advertising fund, to be expended through some such agency as the Idaho state chamber of commerce, was regarded as being too small. The state, it was urged, by its critics, might better reserve the amount for a needed bridge, or something, rather than attempt to merely skim the surface of the advertising pond and get few, if any results. The opposing thought was that it was better than no bread; that something could be done to call attention to Idaho's scenics and that even such megaphonic enterprises might well be worth the cost. So it was believed when the \$50,000 bill was introduced in the legislature that at least that sum would be available for the next two years. the next two years.

But the legislative mind shrunk from it in time, and now it has reduced the item to \$30,000, through house

If that stands, the bill might better be defeated in the opinion of some who have had wide experience in adthe opinion of some who have had write experience in advertising. It is pointed out that after the necessary expenses of salaries, office, etc., are deducted so little will be left for advertising that no results would be obtained. There would be only one record made—of wasting \$30,000. We are stating that as the criticism of others, not as our own.

Usually in cases where something material is taken from little, the effectiveness of the altered original will not be consequential. That may or not apply to the case in point although we admit that a picayunish waste is no more to be condoned than a major waste.

more to be condoned than a major waste. Above all the legislature should consider the effect of its action upon future enterprises. It is always difficult to raise money for public-advertising.—Those-who-give gradgingly or not at all constantly seek precedents. If the state shall establish one of inadequacy and inefficiency, with a \$30,000 state advertising budget for two yans, to what extremities might not communities be forced? Moreover, any future state program would suffer from a preceding false standard. Before the legislature consents to establishment of a possibly bad precedent, it really might better consider abandonment of the entire project until such time as Idaho can do it right—Pocatello Tribune.

Upon no occasion has he sought a definite split with the administration, and while he was manifesting his opposition to some administration courses, he was at the same time being consulted by Mr. Coolidge and Kellogg over the situations. over the situations.




