#### LEFT HANDED TAX REDUCTION

The first administration of D. W. Davis resulted in raising taxes 310 per cent over the wartine tax levy of Moses Alexander. An alleged reduction took place under the second Davis administration, made possible by the fact that a \$2,000,000 bond issue for highways had been voted in 1920.

Under Governor Moore the supposed reduction continued, by assuming that the gas tax which was imposed came out of thin air. As a matter of fact, the total tax under Moore, including the gas tax, was higher than the tax under Governor Davis. The present economy legislature has raised the gas tax one-third and besides boosted the direct state tax more than one-third. The people seem to like this thing, however, since they continue to keep the machine in power in this state.

We are no more infallible than was Rome, whose agricultural develonment was the marvel of the ancient world. 


