



You never can judge a man by his clothes, though ance. Neither can you judge a man by his college degree, the church he attends or the brand of tobacco he uses.

And never in the history of America were books and magazines so numerous or so freely circulated as today. If all these books and magazines were of a high type of literature, we would have no reason for criticism.

But this is not the case. Practically every news stand in the country is carry and load of the so-called "art" and sex magazines as well as a load of other nefarious fiterature, if we are to believe the "Literary Digest," and we have no reason to doubt its statements. Nevertheless we should become enough interested to demand that certain crotic writers cease their "lout productions."

It has been said that when John Toland was dying and his priest of fered consolation, he replied, "My soul is doomed, for I have set in motion in my books a power that shall poison the souls of men in ages yet to come." We realize that these words are true and we realize also that. "The pen is mightier than the sword."
