

We are going to hoast the revivals and hope that much good will come from them but on the other hand there are some rules of the game which should be observed by both parties. One evangelist did this very thing a few years ago and when asked to furnish some proof of the corruption which he said existed in the Twin Falls high school he replied that the cases he was talking about were several years ago and not going on at the present, but in his discourse he did not so state. We know that we are not a lot of saints and we should perhaps do better than we do but what man or woman would like to face all their meanness if same was written down on the billbourds of this city.
