

# WHOLESALE EVACUATION CONTINUES

## Foreigners Draining Out of Yangtze Valley; Cantonese and English Soldiers Clash When Chinese Commander Vessel.

SHANGHAI, March 28 (11:30 p. m.)—The Yangtze valley tonight was being drained of foreigners as the wholesale evacuation of the troublesome area continued under the protecting guns of foreign warships.  
In the city five foreigners were expected soon from Soochow and another United States destroyer today was ordered up river to take aboard refugees.  
One hundred and thirty Japanese refugees arrived at Shanghai from Nanking today, and they said that all Japanese there were leaving.

SHANGHAI, (6:30 p. m.), March 28.—Cantonese nationalist troops and British soldiers clashed today on the Yangtze river at Canton where the Chinese commander a British river steamer. A British destroyer fired into an area, routed the Chinese and recaptured the vessel.  
Reports from Hangchow today said mobs were parading through the city shouting "down with Chiang Kai-Shek." The refusal of the Chinese Cantonese nationalist party were confirmed by refugees arriving from Hangchow. The radical fraction of the Communist party was in control of the city—refugees said.

## Utah Beet Growers Object to \$7 a Ton

SALT LAKE CITY, March 28.—The sugar beet contract price situation in Utah appears to have reached a deadlock.  
Growers in many districts, particularly in northern Utah, say they will not plant beets at 37 minimum guarantee, while growers across the state line in Idaho are receiving 50 cents more per ton.  
Indications today were that chances for 50 cent increase for Utah beets by companies now offering 47 were remote. These companies feel that an Idaho beet is superior in sugar content and therefore a slightly better price. There are already two companies in Utah offering 37.50 a ton initial guarantee.

WASHINGTON, March 28.—Two American marines patrolling the Leon district in Nicaragua were fired upon yesterday by four natives who dropped their arms and fled when the marines returned the fire. Admiral William Lattimer, commander of the United States special service squadron, reported today to the navy department.

Latimer reported also that on March 25 a marine corps plane flying between Del Rio and Matanzas was fired upon and hit near Matanzas. It is known as the Legionarios del Pueblo.

George Cohen and Joe Bloom, alleged underworld characters, were shot to death in the corridor of a fashionable apartment building. Frank Wright, their companion, was seriously wounded.

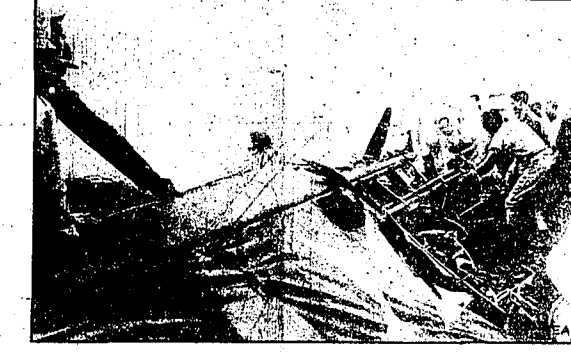

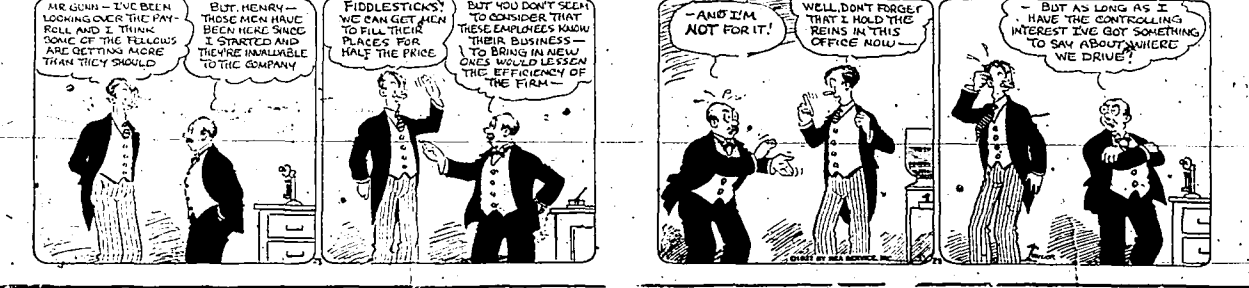
