Monday, April 18, 1927. A SHINING RECORD

To the lasting glory of the Wilson administration, and to the credit of the first and complete collapse of the charge of corruption and criminal maintenance in the expenditure of many billions of dollars in preparation for and fighting the world war.

The charges were sensational and so the national record of the first pages of the newspapers. They were made the sufficient basis for an orgy of editorial and editorial calumny.

It is to be noted that the charges were made by the same party leaders as in the case of the previous events, has been permitted to pass almost unnoticed.

Ralph Hayes, who was secretary to Newton D. Baker when the latter was secretary of war, calls attention, ten years after the fact, to the fact that the national record of what followed from all these charges, He cites the more than fifty searching investigations conducted by committees of a republican congress, and the numerous investigations in making those investigations thorough and unpartisan.

He recalls the numerous wildly sensational allegations made by committee chairmen, by department of justice officials, by senate party leaders as in the case of the numerous grafting that had been indulged and the sure punishment that would follow, the tens of thousands pages of evidence collected by one committee in probe corruption in numerous states and also in France. He recalls the investigations made by eight different agencies of the department of justice. He mentions the three and one-half years of the general investigation of the three divisions of the army, reviewing war contracts of all kinds under congressional direction.

"Then," says this writer, "an amazing thing occurred. As those cases came to trial it developed repeatedly that the prosecution simply did not have the evidence to sustain them. When a third of the indictments fathered by the war transaction section had been tested, the remaining two-thirds were thrown out of the count on the government's own motion."

Out of all the gigantic effort to unearth, probe and punish corruption there emerged two convictions and two acquittals of guilty. The conviction of a motion truck in Texas; acceptance of a "commission" for approving an order for skid chains; pilfering, warranting a \$100 fine, and falsehood in applying for a passport.

There was, we are told, no take it for granted, more pilfering and corruption than investigators and prosecutors have been able to disclose. The expenditures amounted to \$1,500,000 an hour. There is, undoubtedly, have been wide area pilfering. But all charges of gross corruption in high places have been conclusively answered.

When this shining record is compared with the record of the civil and Spanish-American wars, and with the riot of obsequy and corruption that followed a change of administration in 1921, there is established a contrast that speaks for itself out of the testimony of the observation and the equipment of the Woodrow Wilson administration.
