HUNDREDS FORCED TO LEAVE HOMES AS SWOLLEN STREAMS INUNDATE MINING DISTRICT

Warm Weather During Past Week Has Resulted in Heavy Thaw of Mountain Streams; Residents Seeking Safety on High Ground; One Drowned.

By United Press. SPOKANE, Wash., April 27.—Facing the worst disaster in recent years, hundreds of residents of the Coeur d'Alene mining districts abandoned their homes today as mountain streams overflowed their banks.

Placer creek, now a raging torrent, claimed one life when Jack C. Melino, 25, was hurled into it and drowned.

The flood was caused by a sudden thaw of the heavy snow in the mountains, due to the midsummer heat of this week.

Cataldo, south of Kellogg on the Coeur d'Alene river, faced total extinction and the residents have abandoned their homes and sought refuge on higher ground.

The situation in the Pine Creek district is described as the worst in the history of the state, and bridges were wiped out and many persons were driven from their homes.

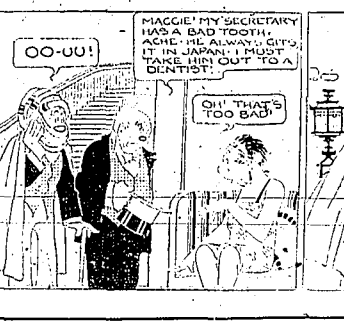
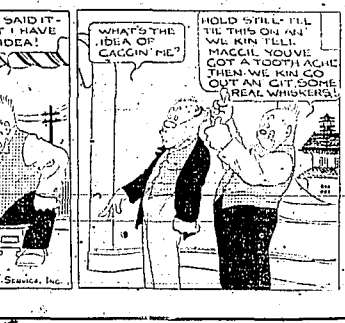
