



PRINCESS IS-WAR-MAKE

Sultan of Sulu's Niece Attempts Reform of Rule in Morolands

By MILES W. VAUGHN
United Press Staff Correspondent.
MANIJA.—The Princess Tarhata Kiram, once beautiful niece of the famed Sultan of Sulu, has set herself single hanged to the task of reforming American rule in the Mohammedan Morolands of the Philippine Islands, Virtually alone the Moro girl, former student of the University of Illinois, intends to continue the war she started against Governor Carol Moore of Sulu early this year until she has won what she considers a square deal for her people.




