## THE FINAL WEEK.

The senior class of the Twin Falls High school this week started carrying out the program which will mark the passing of its members from childhood into manhood and womanhood.

In reality, aid and brushing aside all technicalities, commencement week means exactly what the name indicates. The students have commenced—they have commenced to work. ## OVER THE TOP.

That party bugs and section lines go no remote amount to much in this country again has been proved by the success of the American Red Cross' finance campaign for \$10,000,000 for the relief of the sufferers in the flood zone. Yesterday the appeal for help had brought in a total of \$10,226,508.

A new disaster has hit the middle west, however. Cyclones over the last week have ripped through five states, causing damage estimated at many millions of dollars, killing approximately 228 persons, injuring about 3,000 others and partially destroying 37 towns. The Red Cross has again been called upon for assistance and other aid and officials of the organization have urged that the nation's citizens continue to contribute generously until the victims of these disasters are relieved and rehabilitated.

At present the Red Cross is feeding 200,000 flood refugees. The cyclones have added many thousands more to this total. Homes must be rebuilt and other rehabilitation carried on.

Twin Falls County responded generously to the plea for aid in "going over the top" with its \$2,000 quota. A check for \$200, mailed yesterday, met the request of the national organization. Now, however, comes the new appeal and another quota—probably \$2,000 is assigned this week.

## FRANCE PEERED AGAIN

Search for the lost French aviators at the Tifit Hills is written had taken on a new turn with the French public and some of the members of the Paris chamber of deputies reported as charging the United States with bad faith in connection with the ill-fated flight of Captain Nunsseuer and Col. Gull. One deputy yesterday went so far as to charge that the United States had deliberately sent out misleading information relative to weather conditions on this side of the Atlantic at the time the two fliers started on their trip in order to give American aviators a chance to cross from New York to Paris first.

This proposition of Europe becoming puffed every time the United States does or does not do something is a common one in Europe, says something is becoming tiresome. If it continues, it would seem that the state department should inform Europe that the patience of the American public is reaching the breaking point.

Events since the World War have taken such a trend as to indicate that Europe hardly appreciated the help this country gave in that great conflict. There have been disputes over the amount the foreign powers owed this country and they have even gone so far as to almost directly demand that the United States should cancel the debts they contracted during the war.

Recently two American collectors' programs discussed the debt proposition, one taking the stand that the amounts borrowed to carry on the war should be canceled from the treasury books and the other contending that the treasuries of several European countries reluctantly agreed and in which they agreed to pay over a period of years amounts actually far below those borrowed, should be canceled out.

England immediately sent a formal note to the United States asking if there was any hope the debt being canceled? This note was dispatched to Washington in face of the oft-repeated declaration of the American government under both democratic and republican régimes, that the debts positively would not be canceled and that each country would be required to pay in accordance with its capacity. Secretary Kellogg sent a telegraph in reply in which he repeated this government's re-

Official denials were made at Paris yesterday in which the English still refuse but the fact remains that there are at least rumors of charges being made against the United States and, in line with the old adage, "where there is smoke there must be some fire."

The whole question of the United States relations with these when the country aided in a time of need is becoming more disturbing every day.
