COOLIDGE RECOVERS AND RESUMES WORK

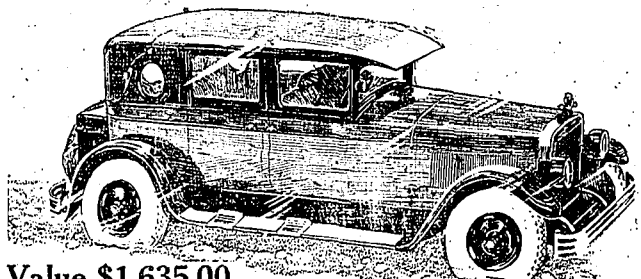
