DIVORCE ISSUE SIDETRACKED Presbyterians Hold Question of Tightening Laws in Abeyance at Meet.

By United Press. SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., May 25.—With the divorce question, believed definitely settled, chief leaders of delegates to the 125th general assembly of the Presbyterian church in the United States shifted today to the election of moderators, supreme officers of the church.

Efforts of an anti-unionist to eliminate divorce as a legalized ground for divorce, and to forbid ministers to marry persons divorced, was temporarily halted yesterday when an motion of Dr. Mark A. Matthews of Seattle, the judicial committee voted to postpone consideration of the question until November.

Keeps Plaid Off Floor. This will keep the divorce question off the floor of the convention, which opens formally tomorrow, church leaders said.

Dr. Robert E. Speer of New York continued to urge the restriction of the race for moderatorship, but many of the church leaders even among his flock, feared his election is doubtful.

One of the chief difficulties, they said, is that for Dr. Speer to be elected would be to make a candidate in the race that he does not want.
