



#### PROMOTING CRIME OR JUSTICE?

The Times recently has made comment upon what seems to be a failure of courts and juries to mete out punishment sufficiently severe to curie-murderly.

Later, two brothers of the guilty-mon were captured in Ohio and taken to Oregon to face trial on the same charge. Yesterday they suddenly confessed and all three were sent to prison for life. 


