GEN. SAM HOUSTON IS HONORED WITH MONUMENT IN VIRGINIA

Kiwanis Club Erects Shaft to Warrior at His Birthplace on the Lee Highway.

General Sam Houston, the military hero of the Southwest, died in the battle of San Jacinto in 1836 and continued an international fame until his death in 1863. His residence from 1830 has been honored by the erection of a monument at his birthplace at "The Old Place," Houston county, Va., five miles north of Lexington, on the Lee Highway. The shaft to the monument was erected by a committee of the Lexington Kiwanis Club.

Through the cooperation of the State highway department of Virginia, which authorized the highway and built an additional driveway around the east of the house, signs have been placed on the highway to let motorists know they are approaching the birthplace of Houston.

The shaft is of rubble masonry standing about six and a half feet high and is five and a half feet wide. Mounted on top is a large bronze tablet, flanked by the Kiwanis Club of Houston, Texas, which indicates the exact site of the house in which the general was born. Had the general lived, he would have made him the Old Place an always a darling one, rich in the drama of the times.

Houston, his 27-year-old son, John, who returned with his mother, wife and six children, was in an uprising of 1810. He was shot and killed by a crew of plotting a wholesale conspiracy to get the government's money and they seized all of them and put them in Texas. The coup appeared to have been completely successful. Sam Houston was born March 2, 1793. When he was 19 the War of 1812 was declared and he was recruited in those days were called communally. A sergeant accompanied him through the street leading a supply of silver dollars, which were laid out on the level of a ground. He stepped up and took his dollar; that completed the ceremony. He stepped up for his dollar when the recruiting party started off to town where he was being in Tennessee and was shortly landed off to help fight the Creek Indians.

ent plans and estimated future needs. Following the lead of Los Angeles, other municipalities in California now joined the campaign of vacation movement and opened camps in the national forests. Oakland has two camps, Tenthredine and Feather Lake. In the Stanislaus and Plumas national forests, there are two camps, and Echo Lake in the Stanislaus and El Dorado forests; San Francisco one, on private land in the Stanislaus forest; Stockton one, at Silver Lake in the El Dorado forest and the city of San Bernardino, and Riverside county one each in the San Bernardino national forest.

Nearly 10,000 Californians yearly avail themselves of the vacation opportunities afforded by these camps.

Each city camp has a large tent or built camp building which usually serves both as a reception center and dining hall. For sleeping quarters, cabins or wooden-floor tents equipped with iron beds, mattresses and pillows are provided. White pitchers and bowls, lamps and other articles of camp equipment are arranged on desks from the camp stores. In addition to articles of personal clothing, each camper must furnish his own sheets and blankets, toilet articles and a bathing suit. Musical instruments, fishing tackle and cameras are allowed in camp but phonographs, radios and personal pets are barred. Good wholesome food is served at the mess hall, either in cafeteria or family style, and lunches are put up for outdoor parties without extra charge.

Small stores are maintained in many camps at which one may purchase simple articles, clothing, candy, soda-pop, stamps, toilet articles and other sundries.

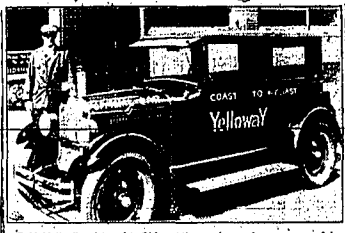

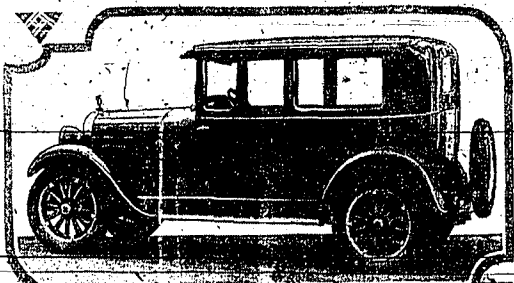
