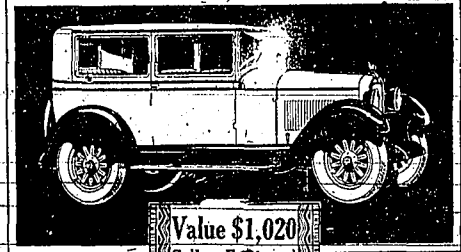

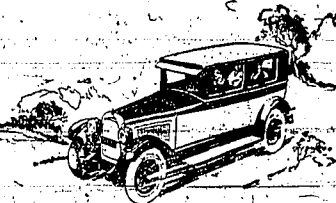

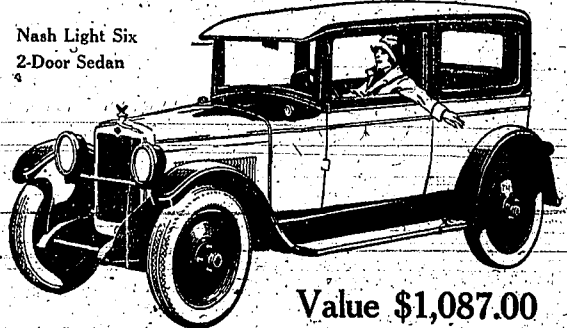

## A DISTASTEFUL QUARREL ENDS

Henry Ford, world's richest man and famous automobile manufacturer, has halted the quarrel between his publication, The Dearborn Independent, and Jewry.  
 Mr. Ford, in a statement issued yesterday through Arthur Brisbane, world-famous editor, said that he did not realize how serious the situation between his paper and Jewish publications had become until he read some articles written by his editor. After doing so he issued orders for the attacks against the Jews to end.  
 The alarm mentioned light has been going on for two or three years and was one of the basic causes of the million dollar libel suit filed by Aaron Sapiro, a Jew, and noted organizer of cooperative marketing associations and an attorney of national reputation. In view of Mr. Ford's latest action, Sapiro's lawyers have announced they are willing to settle the action, and it is believed they may even go so far as to withdraw the suit if Mr. Ford will pay the costs which have been incurred thus far.  
 The ending of the "mad singing" battle between the Ford paper and the Jewish organizations will, no doubt, be welcomed by a majority of the nation's citizens. A fight of that sort never settled any issue and if the Jewish organizations have violated their laws and Mr. Ford's editor chooses to fight them, either side or federal officials took action to prosecute them. If they are not guilty, all of the mad singing in the world could not make them so.

## ONE STEP NEARER

The outlook at the Geneva arms conference is dark. England has stated positively, through her delegate to the meeting called by President Coolidge in an effort to curtail construction of auxiliary craft such as submarines, destroyers, etc. that she will not comply with America's demands.  
 Mr. Coolidge's program calls for a reduction in tonnage. England is insisting on an increase, thus defeating at the outset the very purpose for which the conference was convoked.  
 Thus another attempt to bring world peace seems to be doomed and, unless England recedes from her position, the final construction of the world's armaments will be complete.  
 Officials at Washington still are hopeful of a compromise but at Geneva the situation is declared to be gloomy.  
 Administration leaders yesterday declared that if the conference fails this country will adopt the following measures:  
 1.—Put the full blame for the conference failure on the British.  
 2.—Start an auxiliary naval program to approximate the British strength.  
 That platform is a sane one and every citizen of the United States undoubtedly will give his approval to the measures which will again prove to England and others that America, while wanting peace and striving desperately to obtain it, will not be caught napping and will be prepared for any emergency.

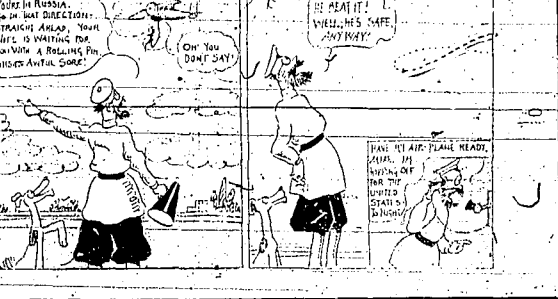

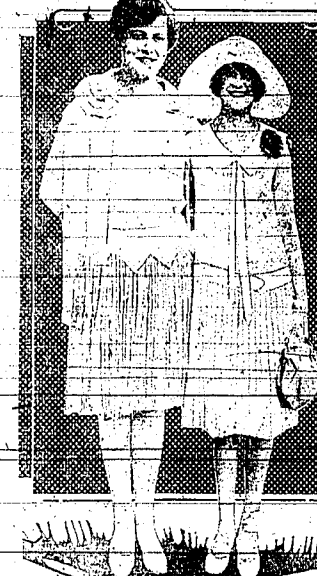

# Will O'-The-Wisp Still a Mystery

Dismissed by Scientists as Doubtful or Extinct Phenomenon, It Has Now Been Revived As Authentic by Fresh Observations.
