ANOTHER WELCOMED ACTION

Regardless of the merits of the religious controversy in Mexico, between the government headed by President Calles and the Catholic church, the entire situation moved a step nearer peace yesterday.

SAYS 1927 WEATHER TO EQUAL 'COLD YEAR'

WASHINGTON—Agriculture changes have attained effect on a number of conditions, according to reports by the recent changes in temperatures. In the recent season currents of warm and cold water, in the Indian ocean, have been observed.

That those changes, caused by the sea reaching the maximum in a few years, have had effect on the climatic conditions for the past six months throughout the entire hemisphere, is shown in the various weather fluctuations.

These fluctuations, drought, hail, storms, cloudbursts, heavy rains and cold waves have all taken toll, and the ultimate effects from these conditions of the ocean can not yet be accurately forecast.

The influence of ocean currents on the winds, which in turn have their effect on the climatic conditions, are responsible, in part, for the unusual weather for the first six months of 1927, which is comparable to that of the year known as 'cold' in the summer, he believes.

The temperature of sea and water areas, he said, still remains dominant in their zones, leaving the tropical waters and those of the semi-circled bordering seas to bear the brunt of maintaining the warm winds sweeping the hinterlands of the continental areas.

The interference here for cold winds generally flows winter, which is precipitation widely across the North Temperate zones," Brown believes. "The oceanic winds, which are driven before the beginning of fall, although the intensity of each local effect can not yet be determined.

Reduction of barometrical gradient between cold and warm water areas will inevitably mean a slackening of the winds blowing clockwise around the North Atlantic and other areas which are never very strong.




How do birds find their way home? What the ornithologist has learned, which is extraordinarily fitted in the art of navigation, is that birds from their nests in the deep woods, they invariably return, almost as though to the air, and it is not until a few days after the first of August that they are seen again.

The writer recently found an incubated nest of a pair of bluebirds, which he had discovered in a hole in the wall of a barn. The nest was made of mud and lined with hair and feathers.
