REED TALKED AS POSSIBLE

State Committeeemen Declare Reed Sentiment Strong Though Wet.

RAPID CITY, S. D., July 18.—

Prominent democrats in South Dakota are talking about Senator James A. Reed, democrat, Missouri, the 1928 presidential nominee of their party.

Governor W. J. Bulow, Judge Charles J. Buell and T. B. Werner, democratic state committeeemen, have informed the United Press that Reed is the man to stand for the party in 1928, though he is wet. They expressed the opinion that the state delegation might be for the Missourian next year.

Reed is considered a western man, and is well known in this state, while Governor Al Smith of New York, the other prominent democrat, is wet, is not very well known here.

Opinions of several prominent westerners are considered here to be quite expressive of democratic sentiment in this state. In fact, the wettest part west which is somewhat along the same lines as South Dakota.

Bulow is the old, democratic, pro-war, pro-territorialist in a republican state in years. Buell is a democrat and he and Werner have long been dedicated to Democratic national con-

ventions. Reed, who has been mentioned thus far, is the most prominent democrat in the state, and is in the same class as South Dakota.

While there is hardly a chance for democrats to carry this state in the election, sentiment of democrats here may be important because of the decision of western democrats toward selection of the democratic nominee.

Democrats have made it clear that the South Dakota delegation does not go out for Reed if he may be pledged to Bulow, who favors Reed as against other prominent candidates who have been mentioned thus far.

Up to this time Reed has failed to develop much support outside of his home state, but the recent addition of South Dakota indicates the adding of several western states.

While Reed's popularity here was not great, he has been mentioned as a possible candidate for the nomination, with circumscribed stories that Everett Sanders, secretary to Fred C. Gilchrist, chairman of the independent slate, will be named August 1 for the lead.

Sanders indignantly denied reports of contemplated nomination, but said he had no objection to leaving a few seats open. He may take a vacation during the latter part of the year or, when he returns to Washington,

CARS PILE UP; NONE INJURED

An automobile accident, in which two cars were badly damaged and five of six passengers "incurably" escaped serious injury or death occurred at the highway junction of State 14 and 15, near Twin Falls, Idaho, yesterday morning.

The crash occurred when Mr. Avery of Twin Falls who was driving east toward Arco, shot, started machine and collided with a car driven by W. M. Hinden of Twin Falls, Alvy, according to his statement, was unable to identify the driver of the other car, one was injured, but both cars were virtually demolished.

CHAMBERLIN WILL PILOT PASSENGER PLANES OVER SEA

Proposed Plans for First Ocean Passenger Trip of Bellanca Type.

NEARING NEW YORK, July 18.—United States aviator Charles L. Chamberlin, of the Bellanca monoplane Columbia from New York to Germany, said the Levant was nearing New York and intended to fly the first passenger plane across the Atlantic next summer.

The plane, intended for the flight without a stop, the longest type of aircraft, would be built with automatic control so if experiments of last four years result in instruments, it would be safe to make a nonstop flight across the Atlantic. It is possible now for an engineer to stand behind the pilot's seat, "What is needed by aviators for more complete safety is to have the passenger sit next to them with which ships are now navigated."

"With the new aircraft, the airplane can be controlled by a man who makes observations and checks on progress of the flight, at the same time navigating more accurately."

"The weight of such equipment, however, would be too heavy to be compensated for by cutting down one man from the crew."

"The next flight across the Atlantic will be the first practical use of carrying passengers besides a load of fuel and crew."
