GERMANY HAS LITTLE FEAR OF MONARCHISTS

EDITOR'S NOTE—The Germans are holding Kaiser Wilhelm to return to his native land without the consent of the government, which expired today, has been extended for two years.

Germany can permit the ex-Kaiser to return upon any terms at the end of an enforced exile in Holland without jeopardizing the strength of the Republic. There is no active-monarchist movement in Germany at the present time and the Hohenzollern have no power to initiate a new movement. The ex-Kaiser, who has been living in Germany for several years, has failed to develop a national movement and is under constant critical observation by the government. The Kaiser, if ever he returns, will live in no better position.

For the railway ruler to go back to Germany would be to subject himself to many indignities. It is not the custom of exiled rulers to return as a voluntary subject among the citizens over whom they once exercised sovereign powers. If the ex-Kaiser breaks this rule he is not likely to be pleased with the outcome. During his occupancy of the throne, he was a monarchist; appointed by God to rule over Germany, which he accepted by the Germans without question. But, the designer who has withdrawn his support—has renounced his obligations—has treated the Hohenzollerns with great generosity and an almost diametrically. Their private property has been restored to them on the ground that confiscation is illegal. The government might have forced the Hohenzollerns to pay as far as possible for the restoration of their property. The government has, however, overlooked Germany during their rule. But, such a move would have given strengthening of the left wing of the German communist who seek to overthrow the present government. It is not clear how much more to show the strength of the German government.

This attitude is in no way a sign of special indulgence to the monarchy. It is the only one of its kind in that the decision to permit the Hohenzollerns to keep their property rights.

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The German republic is eventually, by give way to a new monarchy. There is no sign of any such possibility at present. After the French empire was overthrown, the constitution and the republic was established. France had a more rapid transition during the early years of the new government to prevent its overthrow than Germany has had. But, the French republic has been the same and still endures. There may come a new disaster to Germany, such as an earthquake, which may bring on by the republic, which would probably give the monarchists a chance to return to power. But, such a disaster is not possible for many years to come. We are more eventually to replace the German republic and the ex-Kaiser nor the ex-royal prince would be the likely welder of the republic. Both are too closely connected with the disaster of the world war and it is not possible for Germany to let them be brought back from the field of battle to neutral soil. Nevertheless, it is difficult to see how a republic in a different country, especially when the people set a high value on stability. There are several feet of the German monarchist. Notably the Bavarian, which might tempt to the Imperial title. If Germany were to reconstitute the monarchist rank. But, it may content for the throne, Hohenzollern name would carry the largest following, for despite the debacle of the world war, the Hohenzollerns united Germany and created the empire.

"But, this is a battle," he declared, "for the future. President von Hindenburg has sworn to uphold the republic and he has shown repeatedly to be a man of his word. The Kaiser can expect no help from his former field marshal. Von Hindenburg was defeated in the world war but he did not desert his country and he remains Germany's chief executive officer. So if the ex-Kaiser returns, he will be as a subject owing Von Hindenburg a life-long debt, and as his viceroy."

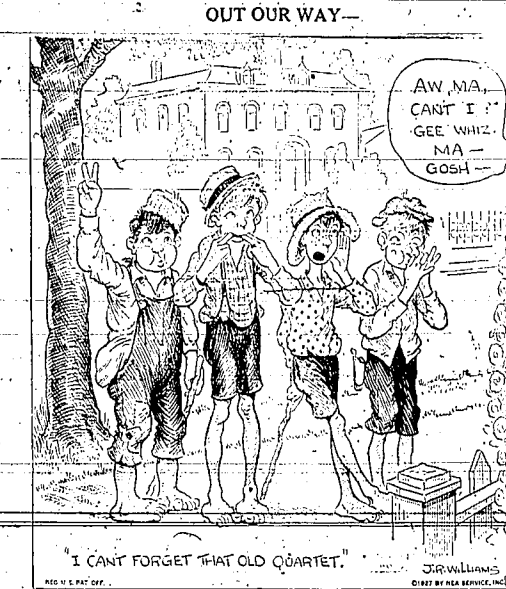

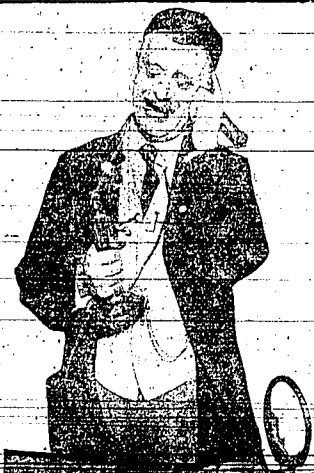

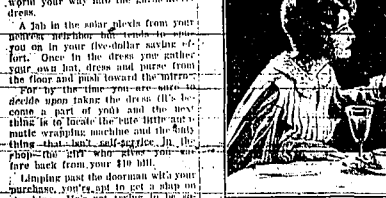
