# BIGGEST NAVAL VESSELS AFLOAT WILL CARRY SEAPLANES FOR U. S.

The two latest vessels ever constructed by any navy soon will be added to the fleet of the U. S. navy. They are the U. S. S. Saratoga and Lexington, amphibious carriers of planes. These ships are the "Germans," called at sea until 1917, when congress planned to build six super-battleships, the Constellation, Connecticut, Lexington, Henser, Saratoga and the United States.

The world must have drawn an exclamation point at the size of these vessels. Each ship will be over 300 feet long, the first will be over an acre of deck, 100 feet high, 25-inch super-turbine engines and right 25-inch turbo dies. Each was built in the best world in naval construction, with complement of 1500 men and a speed of 31 knots an hour.

Now, however, only the Saratoga and the Lexington remain, the former being completed at Philadelphia, Pa., and the latter at Quincy, Mass. They have been converted from super-battleships to carrier planes. Plans were approved to be built in 1917, but they were canceled, and the popular military opinion to be that "they were never built and men will seek for them."

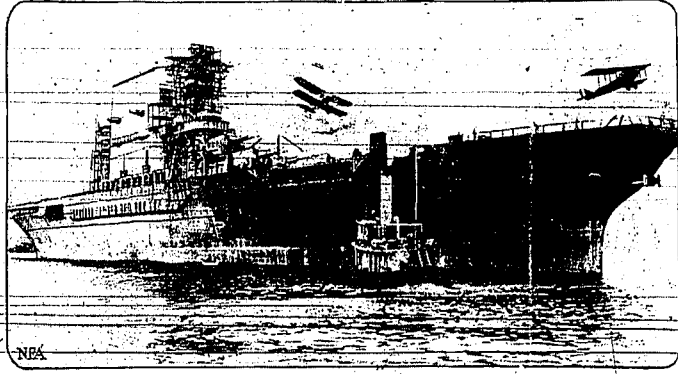
The Lexington and Saratoga represent the ultimate in naval construction. They are in general sister ships. As one can easily imagine, building these ships cost a whole of a job, for many things are enclosed in them no other ship has known.

First, of course is the intricate construction of the hull. The hull is built in a way that it can be taken apart for planes to land and take off. The U. S. S. Saratoga, our first carrier, has a deck 100 feet long, 100 feet wide, and a 25-foot over top hump which is employed as a collar. This was built in flat deck covering the ship. hangar space, the immunity of which hardly can be appreciated by one who has not seen it. When you see that the ships are as long as a football field, 200-foot deck, perhaps 100 feet wide, and the deck is as high as a two-story building, it is not surprising that the ships are so full of planes. There is room for stowing several hundred planes; there is a huge power plant which can generate enough power to meet the needs of a Boston, San Francisco or any other large city.
