

# \$15,000 DAMAGE IN EDEN GARAGE FIRE

## BLAZE WIPES OUT BUILDING

### Man Who Discovers Flames Barely Saves Family From Death

Special Dispatch to The Times  
 EDEN, Aug. 6.—Eden's big garage was totally destroyed by fire early this morning, resulting in an estimated loss of from \$10,000 to \$15,000. The cause of the fire that reduced the H. Way garage to ashes is unknown.

Bob Martin, who, with his family, lives in a house at the rear of the garage, discovered the blaze when he was awakened by explosions. He rushed into the building and found the interior "a mass of flames." All that he was able to do was to hurry to rescue his wife and baby sleeping in the house just as it, too, burst into flames.

The contents of the building were completely destroyed, there being several trucks and a number of touring cars in the place at the time. H. Way owned the garage and he suffers almost a total loss, for only a small part of the contents are insured, the loss being covered by insurance.

The fire had gained such headway before it was discovered that it was useless to apply the hose, which was kept playing on the flames that licked at a gasoline filling station front to keep it from exploding.

Cause of the blaze, which was one of the largest in the history of the town, remains a mystery.

## COOLIDGE ENDS ALL DOUBT ON QUITTING RACE

**Clears Way for Open Contest in Latest Parley With Newspapermen**

 LAFAYETTE, Pa., Aug. 6.—President Coolidge in the belief of everybody today has completely cleared the way for an open contest for the republican presidential nomination next summer.

He let it be known in a conference with the press that he intends to resign when his present term expires March 4, 1929.

Removal Speculation  
 His manner of making the statement, although he refused to amplify his private announcement, removed any suspicion that he "did not choose to be a candidate in 1928," and qualified.

It is understood beyond all question here that Mr. Coolidge under no circumstances will serve his second term. He has been expected to be presented to the national convention.

There had been some speculation in the effect that the "greenback" party might be organized in 1928. It is now believed that the president will not be a candidate in 1928.

The president further was expected to retire from public life completely a year from next March, at least for several months immediately thereafter. He will probably go to his Vermont farm for a rest and then enter some line of private business, as he has no practice.

Feels Free  
 Mr. Coolidge's decision to forego a third year's term was believed based on the fact he feels the strain of his work and he respects "the American tradition of limiting the tenure of one president to eight years. At his present conference yesterday the president made known his desire to plan to call a new, disinterested conference early in 1928 as reported. There would be no break in his term, it was pointed out, to perfect the details of a conference between the first of the year and the expiration of his term in office.

## BRITAIN WANTS CONTROL OF SEA

**Will Not Accept Naval Pact With America, Says Chancellor Churchill**

 LONDON, Aug. 6.—Chancellor of the Exchequer Winston Churchill in a speech here expressed the hope today that Great Britain never would accept a naval pact with the United States on any other basis than that of parity.

He said he would not be prepared to endorse such acceptance, and that the issue raised at Geneva had been raised at Washington by the "and not only the battle fleet but the whole cruiser program had been the issue." He said that the special and vital needs of the British empire, the Washington conference and the London conference had failed.

"We contend that our position is entirely different from that of a self-enclosed community. Therefore, we are now able and it true, as far as the world conference is concerned, which our American friends at that time very fairly and very frankly recognized."

After all the fundamental values which prevented agreement, by the different views of what constitutes naval equality by the Americans and by ourselves.

The problem is one of obsolete difficulties and ought to be studied over a long period of years in order to have a final good conference by the hundred of both sides of the Atlantic.

## DEFENSE OPENS LAST ATTEMPT TO SAVE PAIR

**Appears Are Filed for Sacco and Vanzetti; Little Hope Seen for Success**

 BOSTON, Aug. 6.—Defense legal machinery was whirled into motion today as a last desperate hope of saving Nicola Sacco and Bartolomeo Vanzetti from death in the electric chair five days hence.

Strategically, this eleventh hour battle carries the world fame case back to the little court house in the town of Dedham, on July 14, 1921, a jury which said the two defendants had bribed a paymaster and his clerk to get a motion picture taken of the two men in the case with the defense committee, filed a motion with the clerk of the court, asking that Sacco and Vanzetti be released upon bail.

## WARTIME PRECAUTIONS ARE TAKEN TO PROTECT NATION'S PRESIDENT

**Heavy Guard Is Thrown Around Coolidge Following Bomb Outrages in East; Executive Usually Supports Courts in Decisions**

 WASHINGTON, Aug. 6.—The president of the United States today was surrounded by a heavy guard of troops which protected the chief executive during the war, following reports of radical violence, protesting against the destruction of Sacco and Vanzetti.

When report was received from New York that a bomb had been exploded, presumably by sympathizers of the condemned anarchists, agents of security were ordered to surround the president's summer home completely. Vigilance of secret service men was increased.

Will Challenge All  
 Since Governor Fuller issued his decision holding the two radicals must die, secret service men have been told to employ unusual precautions. A detail of 50 soldiers from the 2nd Cavalry, 1st Division, was sent to challenge anyone approaching the building.

The United Press learned that more than 100 soldiers were received by the president since announcement of the execution of Sacco and Vanzetti.

During the trip to Deadwood Thursday some demonstrators had been anticipated and unusual precautions were taken to prevent it.

The increased guard of the president was merely of precautionary nature. It is not believed any attempt will be made to do bodily harm to the president.

# REFORESTATION NEEDED NECESSARY FOR PREVENTION OF BIG FLOODS

## Little Likelihood Huge Inundations Will Ever Be Controlled Unless Denuding Forest Slopes Is Halted, Says Expert.

By THOMAS L. STOKES  
(United Press Staff Correspondent)

WASHINGTON.—Reforestation of denuded areas along great river systems of the United States will be the part of a permanent flood control program adopted by congress when it tackles the question, long regarded as an expert opinion, especially evident after analysis of the devastating drought in the southern Mississippi Valley this spring.

Forests of themselves do not prevent floods. They must be planted, according to the Mississippi flood prevention bill that the committee has passed. It is the removal of the forest that is the cause of the trouble, says an expert on the subject, "American Forestry and Forest Life," a magazine, W. T. Greeley, chief of the United States forestry service at the Roosevelt State director of the Lake States Park Experiment Station, at St. Paul, Minnesota.

"In dealing with this problem, forestry should be the handmaid of engineering; but it is forestry that has a valuable service offer," Greeley says, summarizing.

The chief office of forests is in the amount of soil which is washed into river waters and raises their level. It is the excess of soil which is the cause of the big floods.

"If soil erosion, either from denuding of slopes or from the cutting of a hill, is not stopped, there is little likelihood that floods will ever be controlled," he said.

"It is not so much the storage of water in the forest floor that gives rise to a periodic overflow, but the regulation of stream flow as their ability to prevent erosion. Floods are most important when they occur at the height of flood waters in the rivers, after the soil has carried its load of water to the sea. The water brought down by smaller streams, often increase stream volume to such an extent that a periodic overflow will reach it. It comes from the debris and sediment.

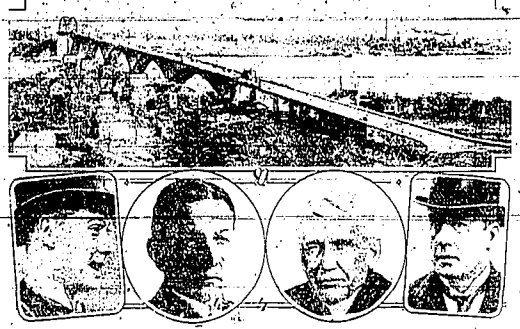
## 10,000 More Barbers Required for Bobbing

Thus, it is obvious, forest land acts as a sponge to take in water which would otherwise flow into streams and heighten their flood stages.

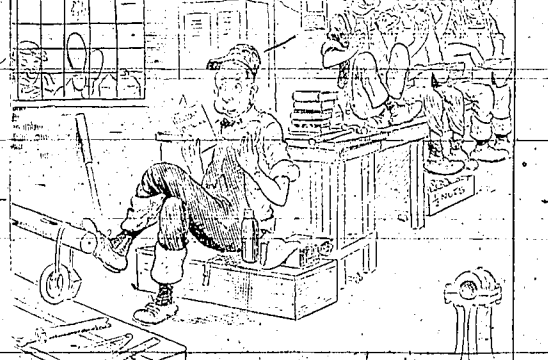

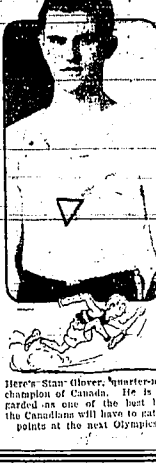
In a recent meeting of the committee to alter the result of the experiment figures showed a decrease of more than 2000 in the number of men admitted to the workhouse.

Hudson Strait, which links Hudson Bay with the North Atlantic, is the key to a great transportation problem—the linking of the middle west to the east coast by way of the Hudson Bay railway. But if it is found that ice and fog make the strait too dangerous as a regular steamship route, the \$20,000,000 already spent on the railway and harbor at Port Nelson will be a total loss.

It is for the airman to determine whether it is possible to ship grain over this route during the summer. This is being done by two days the trip to Europe and returning with the same transfers on the Great Lakes. And they will decide, if this route is found reasonably available.

Two points—Port Nelson and Port Churchill, ninety miles to the north, are the points to be used. The first July two miles will lead north from Halifax carrying the expedition's planes and other passengers. The second will be to Port Churchill, to the harbor of the Strait. The expedition will cost more than \$100,000 but it will settle one way or the other, a burning issue that has puzzled the Canadian Middle West to feverish excitement.

The Hudson Bay railroad is a government undertaking. Since 1910 successive governments, under most sure from the Western provinces, have pushed the work. At the present time the route from Port Nelson, 222 miles northeast toward Port Nelson and Hudson Bay, a ninety-mile stretch of one-way track, is being completed. Port Nelson was selected for the terminal and the 200,000 acres of land around it, the harbor there, but of little value had been taken. Perhaps Port Churchill would be better.

Some would make the route prohibitive, while others point to the fact that the Hudson Bay route has been open for 200 years and has only lost two ships. It is all very complicated. Now the Royal Canadian Mounted Police has been summoned to the task of ascertaining the truth.

Should the Hudson Bay route, feasible, the cost will, with the necessary port and grain transfer facilities, an additional \$10,000,000. # French View of Divorce Problem

## Lawyer Says Hasty Decisions Are Not to Be Obtained by Foreigners

American experts to obtain divorces quickly and easily in France, according to J. G. Maurin, a member of the Paris bar, now residing here, have been misled. He said that the French Consulate, through the numerous French judicial authorities, is making it very difficult for a divorcee to obtain a divorce in France. The French courts do not, however, have a more lenient view of divorce cases. Their conception of divorce is, especially of the judicially. A French court, however, can take cognizance of the divorce at any time the plaintiff has been in the country for a short time. It is true that French law is liberal in matters regarding divorce. It has no objection to granting the divorce in France, and the French authorities of the law being that justice cannot be denied to those who seek it. French law, nevertheless, contains certain provisions that cannot be overruled except by amending the code. The French courts are not to be blamed, but the plaintiffs themselves and certain newspapers are.

Most of all, in order to obtain a divorce in France, the plaintiff must have a valid reason as demanded by French law, and it should be noted that divorce by mutual consent is not admitted, as many people in America seem to believe. Divorce can be granted only on the ground of adultery, cruelty and competition for infamous crimes. Inasmuch as it is a crime, these grounds also apply to actions between foreigners domiciled in France. If recognized by their national laws, the grounds are not to be considered as a fault or "grave injury." Also, the parties of law must be true and lawful residents of France. It is in this connection that divorce has been complicated, but recent instructions from the President of the Civil Court of Paris have put a stop to such abuses.
