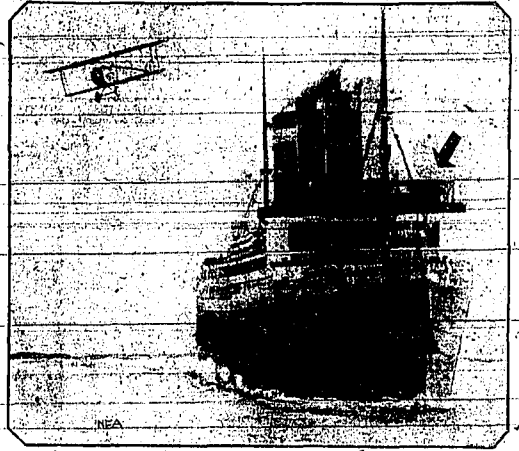

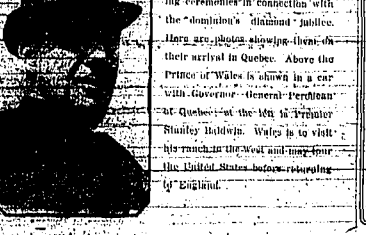

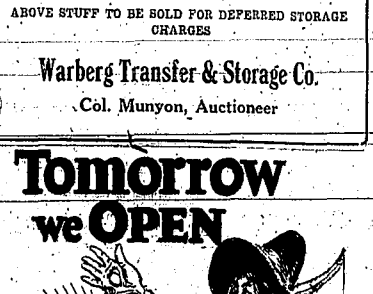

PREDICT GATE OF 2 MILLION

 CHICAGO, Aug. 6.—Tex Rickard is back in Chicago expressing the opinion that the Dempsey-Kemp fight scheduled to be staged at Soldier's Field on September 22, will draw a gate of \$2,000,000.

Rickard is here making preliminary plans for the local ticket sale. He is expected to announce the date of the conference with George Ziegler, the nominal producer of the big bout. He will leave today in order to attend the Delaney-Pattin fight in New York and will return to Chicago to attend the Dempsey-Kemp fight.

The New York promoter believes he will be able to crowd 15,000 persons into the mammoth Soldier's field. He is expected to announce the date of the ticket sale in the next few days. Tickets will be reserved.

In view of the possible \$2,000,000 gate, it is estimated that the Dempsey-Kemp fight will draw about \$750,000, while Dempsey will get about \$250,000.

Phil Gibson, Texaco's manager, is expected here this week to advise Dempsey's manager, Alvin Karpis, who is also in Chicago, of the date of the fight. It is expected that the fight will be held at the Chicago Coliseum.

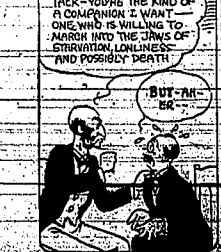

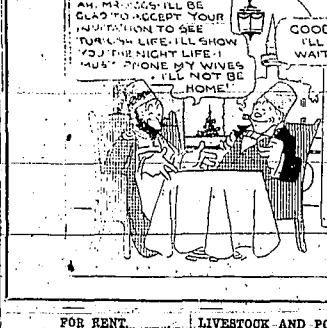
