# WYOMING GRANGES LEADING STATE IN TREBLE ROLL DURING LAST YEAR

## Vast Assistance Is Given Members of Organization Here and Throughout Nation; Will Continue Policies, Declare Local Officials.

Continuing across with granges throughout the country, the Twin Falls county has shown substantially during the last year. Twin Falls granges having counted low for net increase, according to H. C. Eric on speaker.

Granges are the progress of the broadening out in the scope of their achievements. One of the latest and most effective developments is the group purchasing of many of the commodities required by the farmer.

In the United States have shown in the past few years in health, crop, and social conditions. In the political, they can work for the best interests of all the farmer members.

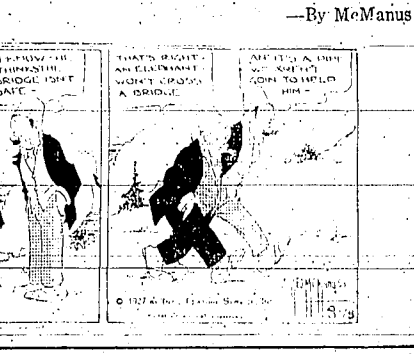

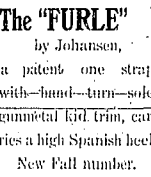
