

WOMAN TO GO DRY FORCE 'COCOS' Beet Harvest Starts Sept. 26, Factory Open Oct. 3

DISTRICT HERE WILL RECEIVE LARGE RETURN Crop and Labor Payments Mean Much Prosperity, Assert Swenson.

Under the present plans of the Amalgamated Sugar company, beet harvest in this district will commence about September 26. If favorable weather prevails, the Twin Falls and Burley factories will commence operation about Monday, October 3, according to W.C. Swenson, district manager of the company.

The field forces of the company have concluded a study of beet raising, involving a comparison of labor requirements. Because of the splendid yield in sugar beets, potatoes, beans and other late maturing crops much land labor will find employment, and large sums of money will be paid for harvest and factory work.

Mr. Swenson estimated Saturday that 1500 farm hands will find employment in the Twin Falls district during the coming harvest. He said that if the fair weather continues, local labor will be able to handle more of the work than will be the case if rains set in and a quick harvest is necessary. It is estimated that \$100,000 will be paid to labor for beet harvest, \$150,000 for potatoes and \$50,000 for beans. In the Twin Falls district, the yield of the sugar company during the refining season will aggregate \$150,000. This figure, according to Mr. Swenson, means that growers of the Twin Falls district are to receive a large portion of money paid to labor. It will naturally result in the business channels, should bring real prosperity to the community.

Full measure of this prosperity can be realized only through the efficient employment of labor and the direction of the effort to the end that crops may be handled in best condition and at the least possible expense. Mr. Swenson declared.

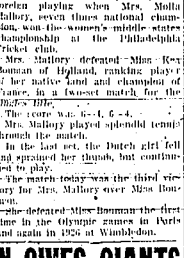

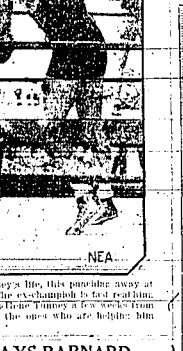

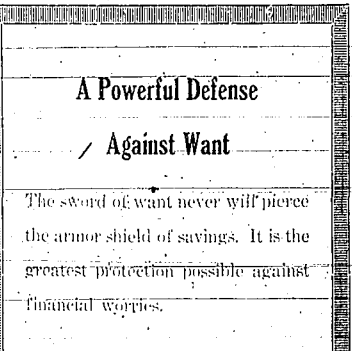

Unveiling the REAL villain behind nurse Cavell's betrayal

LIGHT has finally been thrown on the betrayal of Edith Cavell, the martyr-nurse who in the early part of the World War faced a firing squad as a German sharp-shooter for her humane service to the Allies. Following her execution, a host of nations suspect were made, but in every case there was insufficiency of evidence to warrant the death penalty for them. With the recent publication of French detective records, however, come the complete exposure.

It is now revealed that Miss Cavell's betrayer was a Frenchman by the name of Quirin, who worked in close contact with the members of the French Secret Service and obtained the information which led her to her grave.

Quirin's life is a spiral record of crime—starting in his youth, when as a member of the bar he was implicated in various shady dealings and ending in his execution by the French for his betrayal of the brave nurse, who, during the arduous months of the war, gave succor to stricken prisoners, regardless of nationality or the banners under which they fought.

When the war broke out, he was one of the many of his kind who were sent to the front. He was there in the trenches, but he was not there to fight. He was there to spy. He was there to betray. He was there to sell out his country to the enemy. He was there to bring down the heads of his fellow countrymen on the gallows.

It was a hair-raising look that the rest of the patriots never flagged, and soon a highly organized secret "railway" was sending men, by Holland, back to the fighting fields of France. All of the people in this chain knew only two of their collaborators: the one from whom they received the fugitive and the one to whom they



handed him over. This system of water-tight compartmentment was so effective in maintaining secrecy that it was only through treachery the Germans were able to lay hands upon the leaders and close up the road to freedom. These Franco-Belgian "underground railway" managers, in spite of the vigilance of the Belgian police, to carry on their work for over a year.

The most successful of these "railways" was that operated by the Prince de Croix, of which organization Miss Cavell was the Brussels agent. At the Prince's chateau at Belgisheim, the receiving station for recruits gathered by the local agents of Northern France, candidates for escape were examined by the Prince and, if approved or by the local agent. If their accounts of themselves seemed bona fide, they were given foot clothes and money and sent on to St. Vast, the next station, thence to Mons and Brussels, where it was Miss Cavell's duty to give them into the charge of those who would conduct them safely across the border.

It was into this organization that Quirin finally achieved entrance. After his acquaintance with the German Secret Service and subsequent rejection from military service, he made the acquaintance of a young couple, and was introduced to a French officer in search of refuge. He so impressed the officer that he was named as his successor in the "railway" and stayed at Miss Cavell's home for more than two weeks. During that time, it may well be believed, he picked up news of the situation. He sought by every means to obtain intimate knowledge of the members and details of the organization.

Miss Cavell, a person of the most delicate psychic perceptions, intuitively mistrusted him. His manner was boorish and marked with a far from welcome curiosity. He frequented dice-tables and cafes, bustling in all who were not to be trusted. He was a man of dissipated habits, and that he was staying with Miss Cavell. More often than not, he would utter words of the grossest vulgarity, and she would consider the worse for drink, and there, as elsewhere, he made a rapid conquest of the easy favors of local inhabitants, at the house as servants. Indeed, his conduct was so scandalous that Miss Cavell had to make special requests to him in order to protect her staff from his un-

welcome attentions. Finally he was told, positively, that if he really wanted to get to Holland, he would have to leave the next night, or not at all.

He left, since there was nothing he could do further to delay his departure. But he contrived a ruse to get to Brussels as quickly as possible.

After his arrival at the Hague, in Holland, he was reported as a French officer to Colonel Herzer, the French Military Attaché, and gave to such information about the place where the French soldiers lay hiding and the points at which the frontier could best be crossed that the colonel and his staff, thinking to aid his cause, financed Quirin and sent him back to Brussels.

Upon returning to Brussels, with inconceivable "effrontery" he immediately reported to Miss Cavell, who failed to slam the door in his face only because she did not open it to him.

From this point on a series of her betrayal proceeded rapidly. Quirin obtained valuable information from her unwitting landlady, a Miss Bodart and through her met M.
