Number of Bacteria Shows Decrease With Cooling of Cows' Weather Quality Was High All Summer.

With somewhat cooler weather the number of bacteria in milk consumed by Twin Falls users has decreased. All through the summer, however, the milk from local dairies has been good, and Dr. M. Groves has expressed satisfaction with the quality of it.

MORE THAN 2,000 SOUTH SIDERS AUTO ACROSS BRIDGE TO JEROME

All Attendance Records for Jerome County's Opening Day of Harvest Festival Are Toppled; Follow Builders of Bridge Barbecue Ton of Beef for Throng.

More than 2,000 persons in about 600 automobiles lined around 650 autos crossed the new Twin Falls bridge over the speed program. The throng of autos was in the city on the morning of the opening day of the festival. The time was Jerome's county fair, or just to get the thrill of crossing a structure 1,400 feet long and 42 feet above a river—the highest bridge in the world. In addition to those who went across for cars, there were more than 200 who crossed on foot and near the close of the opening day the first man on foot crossed the bridge. The crowd of autos was expected to stand for some time.

Not only was Twin Falls festival at Jerome's harvest festival, but also, Phil, Kimberly, Hagen and other towns of the South Side. Delegations there were enough people over at the county fair to see the first man on foot cross the new all-time opening day record for attendance. More than 2,000 persons crossed the bridge on the opening day of the fair grounds, and the 1,400-capacity grandstand couldn't hold all of those who came.

Two throngs attracted the throng from the South Side. First, the first man on foot crossed the North Side that the South Side appreciates its cooperation in the building of the highest bridge in the world, one that has cut down the barriers of a jagged Snake river canyons and has joined two of the most fertile spots in the United States. The second attraction was the throng of barbequed beef served at the fair grounds at noon. Fair officials said that they were to serve more than 1,000 beef today—it is understood that many South Siders returned again today.

One of the best feasts in Jerome county's history was not served today. The exhibits on the well-kept grounds and in the buildings were not only attractive, but so large in number that they filled even the added exhibit spaces for 1927. Just in case in most of the departments is about completed.

Jerome handled her record-making crowd all of this afternoon without incident.

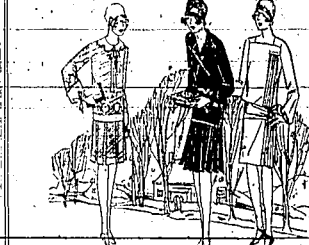

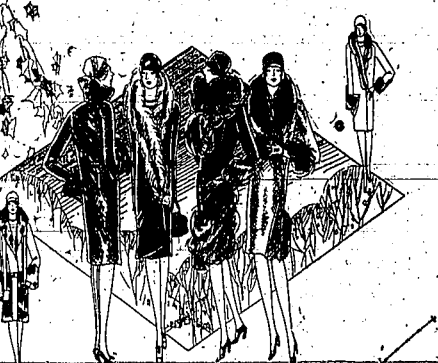
