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TUNNEY'S EYE HURT AGAIN; GENE DENIES IT WILL HARM FIGHTING

Slight Astigmatism Develops After Old Wound Is Reopened by Sparrer; Dempsey Stages Last Hard Work Tonight and Tomorrow.

By HENRY L. FAIRHILL, United Press Staff Correspondent. CHICAGO, Sept. 17.—Gene Tunney nursed an inflamed eye which has become slightly affected with astigmatism as a result of a blow it received from the champion's sporting partner.

Another workout Sunday night probably will end his training. Weighing 192 pounds, at which he hopes to enter the ring, the challenger said he was in perfect shape. "This idea of working under lights is a new thing," he said, and took P. Flynn, his manager who has been in the ring since he was a child, to the arena to see how he would stand under the bright lights of the arena.

Tunney will not boxing today, but he will practice suddenly changed by Billy Gibson, his manager.
