



# SPIRITUAL PAN-ASIAN MOVEMENT EXISTS IN PHILIPPINE ISLANDS

**By WILLIAM R. KEANS**  
 (United Press Staff Correspondent)

**MANILA**—The Pan-Asian movement, with its flavor of Hinduism and mysticism, has apparently passed over the Philippine archipelago without making headway.

**Senator Quezon** and other Filipino leaders in interesting speeches before the press and public speeches, have frequently acknowledged human credulity as the chief reason for the progressive, active interest.

Recent declarations of Admiral Sumner Kettle and other American officials, to the effect that racial Filipino nuclei have been plotting the destruction of naval installations in Manila and other Philippine cities, have shed the spotlight on what appears to be a real, powerful movement.

Signs of the existence of a sympathetic pan-Asian union are unmistakable. The headquarters of the Secret Service in Manila has a street named after radicals, photographs and documents indicating that radical and subversive agitators throughout Asia, the Philippines and the Dutch East Indies, are in constant communication with each other.

Employees of a dozen athletic organizations have viewed the Pan-Asian lobby which they believe is the Nationalist movement, inflated all Asiatic imaginations. These contacts are still in evidence, although movements are watched constantly by the Secret Service and the Philippine constabulary.

Philippine leaders say that they have no definite personal liking for correspondence or financial support, while the former officials, however, have been informed persons believe that this in true. Official investigation shows that the Philippines are little more than a membership, however, the organized "national" pan-Asian movement has in the past two years to one of the most powerful forces in Philippine.

Nationalism comes first, according to all tests, but the Indo-Chinese variety of anti-foreignism takes a close second.
