



TUNNEY TO WIN ON POINTS, SAYS CLARK B. KELSEY

Gene In Greatest Condition of Career; Has Been Working in Secret

LARK VILLA, Ill., Sept. 20.—Having completed his training for the Dempsey fight Thursday night, Gene Tunney is in the greatest condition of his fighting career.

For three weeks Tunney has been training, and finds himself ready to enter the ring against Dempsey in superb condition, after resting during the period, normally of weeks, but actually of a year's duration.

Tunney ended his boxing for the fight with two days of daily boxing. He showed more than he had in the entire time he worked out in the case area and this fact has led to the opinion the writer has held for some time.

Eddie Moran has been around the camp for some reason other than for a number of years, you can know that their companionship is the very weight champion of the world.

This correspondent has believed that Tunney has been boxing with Logan privately, and that his matches with the Oxford man have kept him up to the mark.

In his final boxing before a group of newspaper men, Tunney admitted that he had not shown before. He showed the laugh to those who criticized him for not training sufficiently, by showing the best offense he ever had in a five round test against his sparring partner.

The left was effective as ever, and he produced a new right hand, with the fast left, and the right hand, while he had in reserve, in apt to prove effective in the Dempsey bout.

Following his workout Tunney said he was perfectly satisfied with his condition and boxing. "I've never been in better shape," he said. "Dempsey hasn't any more than he had against Jack Sharkey. There's not a chance he can win. Tunney's manager, Billy Gibson, said after watching Tunney's workout, over a period of weeks, that this correspondent believes Tunney will win on points, unless he forgets to check one of Dempsey's lefts through lack of foresight.

In view of the fact that he has to be between the two, Tunney seems capable of eluding the ex-champion.

CHICAGO, Sept. 20.—"Dempsey will win in three rounds if he gets on the bike. He always does it. It makes Dempsey seven or eight rounds."

This is the pre-fight prediction of Leo J. Flynn, manager of the former champion, who is to attempt Thursday night to regain the title he lost to Gene Tunney last year.

"And if you think I am just going to say it, Flynn continued, I can show you a slip for \$50,000 that I bet on Dempsey to win last year. I can show you that the backers offered me \$100,000 to bet on Dempsey to win last year."

Flynn also said that the whole Dempsey case is going to put their bank case on Dempsey. "They're going to bet on Dempsey to win his championship, and knowing that for a number of years, you can know that their companionship is the very weight champion of the world."

This correspondent has believed that Tunney has been boxing with Logan privately, and that his matches with the Oxford man have kept him up to the mark.

In his final boxing before a group of newspaper men, Tunney admitted that he had not shown before. He showed the laugh to those who criticized him for not training sufficiently, by showing the best offense he ever had in a five round test against his sparring partner.

The left was effective as ever, and he produced a new right hand, with the fast left, and the right hand, while he had in reserve, in apt to prove effective in the Dempsey bout.

Following his workout Tunney said he was perfectly satisfied with his condition and boxing. "I've never been in better shape," he said. "Dempsey hasn't any more than he had against Jack Sharkey. There's not a chance he can win. Tunney's manager, Billy Gibson, said after watching Tunney's workout, over a period of weeks, that this correspondent believes Tunney will win on points, unless he forgets to check one of Dempsey's lefts through lack of foresight.

In view of the fact that he has to be between the two, Tunney seems capable of eluding the ex-champion.
