## Labels Warned

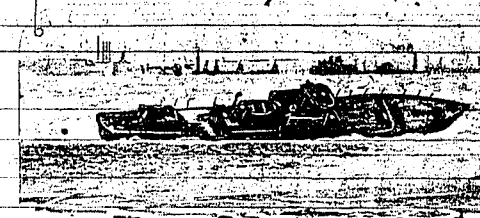

## "Hunting Instinct" Important Point for Those Seeking to Be Liquor Law Agents

WASHINGTON.—Being a difficult and important profession—official is a pleasant or unpleasant job, depending on one's handling. In fact, it is the salary of the Volstead Act and the taking of \$1000 in 1908 which has made it so.

But, the task of getting one of these jobs, under the first 1000 per cent prohibition, is a difficult and worrisome bit of work. The examinations now being conducted by the U. S. civil service commission are probably the most exacting of any technical position in the government.

Examinations of this nature are not previous executive positions, but a test, but not to those is a 1000 per cent examination of each applicant.

Twelve different examinations, under direction of psychology experts, about questions of the prospective administrator, zone supervisor, or assistant commissioner.

Applicants for these higher jobs are much more numerous than those for ordinary executive jobs. Requirements include, besides experience, an age of between 30 and 50 years.

Technical knowledge of the Volstead act itself is not required of these officials, as it is the accuracy, honesty and the administrative and executive ability test, they are believed capable of learning the facts of enforcement technique in a short time.

Applicants for these jobs as well as for secret jobs and in fact all civil service jobs, are asked to state whether they "habitually use intoxicating liquors or narcotics."

### FLYING REQUIRES GREATEST SKILL, KNOWLEDGE AND PHYSICAL STAMINA

(Called Press Staff Correspondent)  
The Federal Bureau of Investigation, through its Bureau of Aeronautics, has issued a report on the qualifications and skills of pilots. The report states that a pilot must have a certain amount of physical stamina and knowledge of the principles of flight. It also mentions that a pilot must be able to handle an emergency situation and be able to land an airplane in a field.

It is his own airplane.
