# BRIDGE DESIGNER TELLS OF WORK

### Nearst Approach to the Height of High Structures in the World

On Sunday afternoon Sept. 27, 1927, I strolled along the south bank of the Snake River Canyon, between Blue Lakes and Shoshone Falls. It was at that time I observed a firm-iron structure across the canyon, the height of which was between the falls and the falls. I had crossed the canyon several times before and it is not very far from the falls in its neighborhood had to be built—this was a new structure—opposite the falls, and the danger of loss of time, expense and danger in these instances.

Between April, 1926, and the beginning of 1927 I made surveys across the canyon from Shoshone Falls down to the mouth of Rock Creek, and the best location for the bridge had been found. Canyon walls at all apparently favorable places were measured. Three points were selected and measured more completely. Centimeter tape, suspension type and angles were used and angles were reported for comparison. The result was a report I prepared in February of 1927 covering general features, underground, location and advocated design.

Subsequent work on this enterprise was complete final in its design, finalizing of preliminary design and securing of plans. It also the operations of detail design and construction has become history. The completed structure stands today on the site selected in 1926.

The character of the structure is the same as recommended in that report. In the final design prepared for construction the height of the bridge varies only two feet from that originally proposed. Tower spans were lengthened and anchorage locations in canyon walls changed some. The roadway was widened three feet, increased and the members made heavier to conform to requirements of the standard regulations used by the United States Bureau of public roads in the design of steel bridges.

A rather careful search has been made through engineering literature to ascertain the height of various high bridges in existence. I believe this structure is the highest ever built for highway traffic.

The nearest approach to the height of our new bridge is that of the St. Quentin in the Tyrol, which has a span of 197 feet and is 422 feet above the water.

Next in point of height is the Pader viaduct over the Rhine River in France, having a span of 178 feet and height of 436 feet above the level of the river.

Fourth in the bridge across Zambesi River in Africa, a 500-foot span, 420 feet high, the water.

Because of the magnitude of the work, it is difficult to compare our bridge with other bridges. Of all the bridges constructed of steel, it is almost equivalent to four ordinary city blocks and nearly one and one-half blocks high. It is 270 feet from the floor down to lower tower base and more than 100 feet from this base down to water in the river. Lower tower base is 50 feet on either side of channel or 100 feet apart. Upper tower base of each tower are 100 feet apart. The bridge is sufficient-looking cast steel rivets.
