The return of beer and introduction of the five-day work week will be urged through the annual report of the executive council.

"The American Federation of Labor at its convention in 1919, 1921 and 1923 pointed out the deplorable condition of our workers, and also recommended that we continue to insist upon the enforcement of the Volstead act," said a report of the executive committee.

POLICE RESCUE GIRLS' ANNOYER

BUTLER STILL FOR COOLIDGE

Seeks to Learn Exact G. O. P. Attitude on President's "Do Not Change"

WASHINGTON, Oct. 3.—A repudiation conference is being held here by the conservative wing of the party, close friend of President Coolidge and chairman of the Republican national committee.

It wants to find out the attitude of national committee on the question of a site for the 1928 Republican national convention and also the attitude of the party in Mr. Coolidge's administration.
