Twenty-five Carloads of the Fruit Shipped From Twin Falls, Yesterday

Apple shipments from Twin Falls reached their highest mark last week when 25 carloads were shipped from the local orchards. The local packing houses reported that the week's business was the best since the start of the season. Shipments were made to various points in the Northwest and to the East coast.

All around the world, weather explained one weather man, who predicted that a month or six weeks of good harvesting weather will keep the crop in the hands of the packers. The weather is expected to be favorable for the remainder of the season.

At the H. H. Sawyer Wholesale, it was planned to start the apple washer with a night work schedule, operating the machine 12 hours a day. At present there are two machines working at night in an effort to keep the fruit in the hands of the packers.

"Apples have it right," said the manager here by one being willing to put in answer to a question on the amount of business he was expected to handle. He said that he was operating at capacity.

The potato harvest is now on in full swing, one orchard here, a representative reported. He said that heavy potato shipments are being made all over the United States and the price is now down with a weak market. He stated that the potatoes are selling at about 80 cents and 85 cents per ton, depending on the size and quality. He expected the season price to be around 80 cents per ton.

The same conditions hold true of the wheat harvest. The wheat that they are moving satisfactorily, with the peak of the harvest yet to be reached. The price of wheat is now between 60 and 50 cents, depending on the size and quality. He expected the season price to be around 50 cents per bushel.
