

DENMAN NAMED TEACHERS' HEAD

FILER-SUPERINTENDENT ELECTED PRESIDENT OF ASSOCIATION AT CLOSING SESSION.

Supt. George E. Denman of Filer was elected president of the fourth district Idaho Education Association which closed its two-day session here Saturday afternoon. Miss Margaret Adams of Burley was elected secretary of the organization.

The election of officers was voted to take by the leaders of the state association and to a vote on the teacher retirement question.

The ballot on the teacher retirement question was submitted to the teacher in the state and the final results will be announced at the state convention in Boise in December.

While the teachers' educational interests must be taken by the legislature, the state officers of the association are endeavoring to learn the attitude of the teachers toward teacher retirement by the ballot method.

The committee feels that certain educational problems, for example, institutional arrangements, require investigation by special committees. These committees should be organized to which these researches may be referred. At this time there is need for assistance in the revision of the curriculum.

Appropriate legislation should be introduced to provide for the hiring of a course of study, making the funds necessary to the employment of experts for the teaching of the subjects, certainly leaving the choice of the teacher in the hands of the school.

ULTRA-CONSERVATISM.

The few efforts being made to discount or belittle the attempt of Ruth Elder and George Haldeman to fly from New York to Paris, are disgusting to those who believe in doing things. The practice of piddling along day after day and never standing for anything except those which never occur before or those which come through tradition does not satisfy the progressive citizen of this day and tomorrow; he sees the merit of those who are striving to go ahead and gives them due credit.

The editor of the morning Twin Falls paper says there apparently was no reason for the flight of Miss Elder and Mr. Haldeman except that Miss Elder sought to be the first woman to cross the ocean. Some of the London newspapers said that the frequency of American flights across the Atlantic were bordering upon a "mania." The two-expression would seem to interlock very nicely for those who are satisfied with a feet-on-the-ground program. The majority of the modern-day people, however, are not satisfied with such a proposition and are proving it in various ways than one.

Using the same argument as advanced by the Twin Falls editor, Christopher Columbus should have halted his exploration when he returned to the old world after discovering the new. He had found a new territory and subsequent journeys were mere publicity stunts. Col. Charles Lindbergh, following the same trend of thought, should have sold his plane "Spirit of St. Louis," at Paris and it would have been proper for him to have gone home after arriving in the United States. His long tour over the country this summer, during which he visited hundreds of cities, including Twin Falls, would be the plainest publicity. It could be argued that the man who has the knowledge of aviation, the man who is interested in the development of aviation, the man who is interested in the Twin Falls edition, Lindbergh must rank as a sensationalist. That argument would brand the amateur world as series is a useless waste of time. Using it as a basis, the writer in the first world series may back there in the dawning days of baseball, should have settled the question for all time.

Coming down to the flight of Miss Elder and Mr. Haldeman, The Times editor asks himself, after reading the morning paper's editorial, whether it is ever possible for anything to be learned or developed through subsequent effort. The answer is—unfortunately to many who live in the world, but it must be admitted that some persons believe they do and come to when it is too late. George Haldeman is a smart pilot and when it must be taken into consideration that even Miss Elder qualified as pilot as she was, would learn something. If the two can do nothing more than to inform other aviators that they encountered a peculiar cross-current of wind approximately 400 miles off the American shore they will have added their brothers that much in future flights and those who believe that aviation is not the future mode of transportation and must be developed the same as the railroads of the past, are as blind to facts as the old fellow who is the father of the hero in The First Auto.

Asked whether he believed "crosses carriage" could travel from Europe to America, the editor of the morning paper said:

"Well, I might go up that fast if it had a motor, but I don't think so."

Continuing along the same line of thought as that set forth by the editor of the local morning newspaper, there is nothing to talk about advancement and development. In other words, the wonderful Twin Falls tract should not have been. When Mr. Peirce settled on the now famous Blue Lakes area the rest of the arrivals should have been satisfied to have reloaded their wagon and to have gone on to Oregon or to have returned to their mid-western or eastern homes. He evidently believes things are and that is all there is to it.
