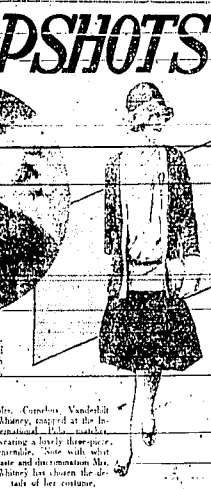

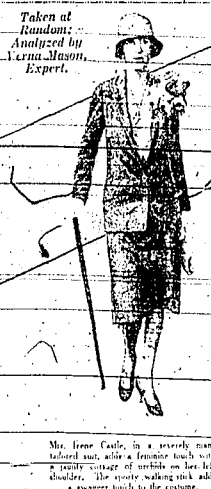

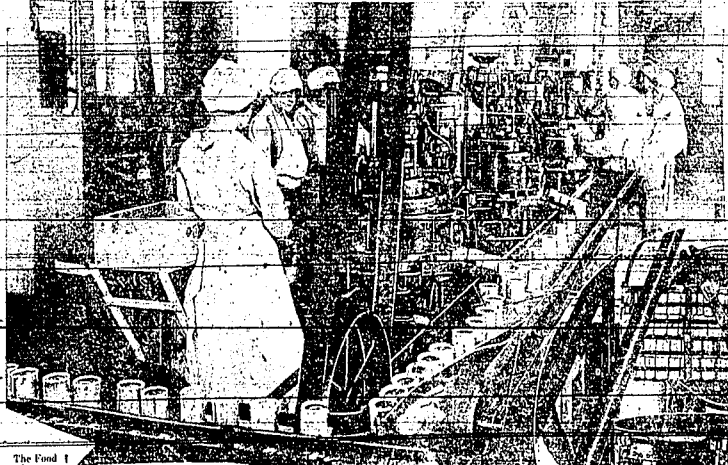

What's in a Can of Vegetables?



The Food I

Flavor Through the Washing, Grading, Pre-Cooking Steps to the Machine, Which Fills It Into the Tin Cans and Adds Hot Salt Water.

Little think of the tin can as an object of symbolic magic power; it is too commonplace in our daily lives. Yet nothing short of a miracle enables us to bring into our homes so many foods daily or frequently, it is important that every woman knows something of their preparation and distribution. The canning industry of today is developed along scientific lines; its procedure is thorough, and its care extremely diligent. From experience the canner has found that certain varieties of vegetables are best adapted for preservation. He has taken the string out of string beans and presented the toothsome stringless variety. This is only one example of proper crop selection for which we are indebted to the seed and fertilizer specialists the canner furnishes his growers with and the fertilizer specialists the canner controls over the harvesting. Such control brings the vegetables to the factory at the prime stage for canning. Handling of material in modern canning factories is so rapid that it is no extraordinary feat to have the finished cans

labeled and sealed within two hours from the time of picking. Thus the slogan, "If it's in a can, it's fresh." In the factory, which is much like a large kitchen, the machinery has taken the place of hand labor, and the raw material is graded, thoroughly cleaned, and prepared for the can. The cans are filled with a definite weight of the vegetable, and hot, salted water is added to cover the content. A heating bath of steam or water drives out the cold air which such vegetables are packed into the cans hold. Then there, as well as all other vegetables packed into cans, goes to the seaming machine, which seals on the top. Steam cookers or retorts are used for further processing, after which the cans are subjected to a prompt cooling to prevent over-cooking. At this point the can is either labeled and cased for shipment or piled in the warehouse for future shipment. Commercially canned foods are healthful; the raw material is chosen fresh and therefore agrees to our kitchens fresh. It is of the best adaptable variety. The Truth About Canned Vegetables

Canned vegetables are very fresh vegetables preserved by heat; they lose little of the nutritive value of the raw product. Canned vegetables may be a valuable asset in supplying the vitamins of the diet. No chemical preservatives or artificial colors are used in the canning of vegetables. Canned do not use copper salts for greening any vegetables. It is against the law. The liquid in canned vegetables is pure water or water to which salt is added. It contains flavor and food value, including mineral salts, and should never be discarded. Use it in soups and sauces, or even to pour over the vegetable. It is perfectly safe to let vegetables stay in the can after the can is opened. However, for storing in the refrigerator, all cooked food should be eaten within 24 hours. In opening a can of vegetables, it is not necessary to aerate them before using. Do not, of course, wash them. Cook for the time directed.

The Institute has found ammonia to be the best type of window cleaning material. Two pieces of chamois are desirable, using one for washing and the other for wiping. While the first good-day chamois will last a long time, it is also very good for hand-mirrors—that is, if they have a silver back. It is not safe to use it, however, on any of the beautiful ivory imitations which are now in vogue, because it will very likely leave a stain on the frame which only the manufacturer, if any one, can remove by buffing. Fall Fruit Desserts

Delightful Seasonal Dishes, Made from Tested Institute Recipes, Which Will Add Variety to Your Menus.

COMPARATIVELY few housewives get the full benefit of the variety of dishes that can be made from apples, pears and cranberries. There really are many ways to dress up the Fall fruits and thus give variety to the menu.

Elder Bread Pudding. Select six slices of bread cut about one-fourth inch thick and weighing one-ounce each. Butter the bread with softened butter and cranberries. Have ready, too, one-half cupful of brown sugar, four cups apples pared, core removed, and one and one-half cups of elderberries.

Peach Fudding. Prepare one and one-half cupful of bread cut in one-fourth inch cubes. Put peaches in small saucepan with one cup of sugar. Mix the peaches and bread cubes as follows: Put one cup of bread cubes in a small bowl. Add the apples, one and one-half cupful of scalded milk and add one-half teaspoonful of vanilla. Sprinkle with one-half cup of sugar and one-half cup of elderberries. Place in a pan containing about one inch of water. Bake about thirty minutes in a hot oven. When cooled, serve with whipped cream.

Apple Tartlets. Pull apart and measure two cupfuls of apples, one cup of sugar, one cup of juice and place in a buttered baking dish. Make a soft crumbly mixture of one cup of flour, one cup of sugar, one-half cup of granulated sugar, two cupfuls of milk and one-half cup of vanilla. Pour mixture over the apple pulp and bake in a hot oven for thirty minutes. When cooled, serve with whipped cream.

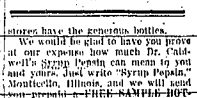

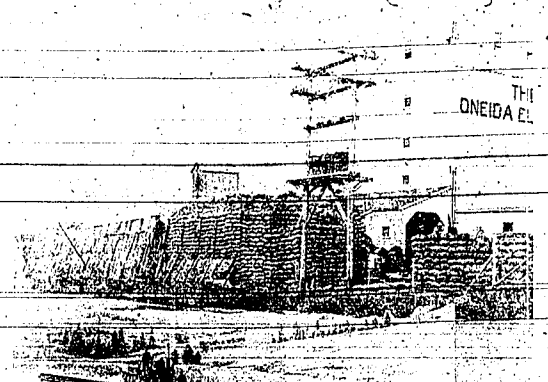


