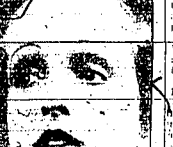
PRINCE CAROL'S BACKERS FLEE ROUMANIAN NET

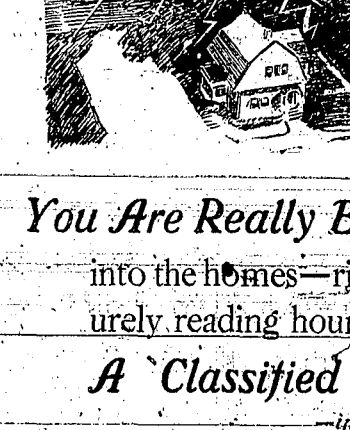
