MOST CERTIFIED BEAN SEED HERE

University Investigator Estimates That Yield Will Be Higher Than 8000 Bushels Practically All the Seed Is in Twin Falls County

MOSCOW, Oct. 27. It is estimated that the yield of certified seed this year will be between 7000 and 8000 bushels from the 250 acres of certified seed in the state, according to the report of Walter H. Pierce of the plant pathology department of the University of Idaho. Mr. Pierce inspected bean fields this summer for the office of the state seed commissioner.

Practically all certified seed in Twin Falls county, where certification work was started last year, is from three other counties, however, at least 90 per cent of the seed that may apply for certification in 1928, Jerome, Blaine and Teton counties are already up to the standards preparatory to starting next year.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for certification beans must be entirely free of anthracnose and bacterial blight and must have less than two per cent mosaic on final inspection and less than five per cent any time during the season. Since the first two diseases have been found only in rare instances in Idaho, attention is centered on eradication of the mosaic disease.

Causes Changes

The adoption of certification requirements is causing a decided change in seed growing methods within Twin Falls county. Many beans were grown last year in the Twin Falls and Ardenville sections and to the Burroughs and Hamilton areas, which are more favorably situated.
