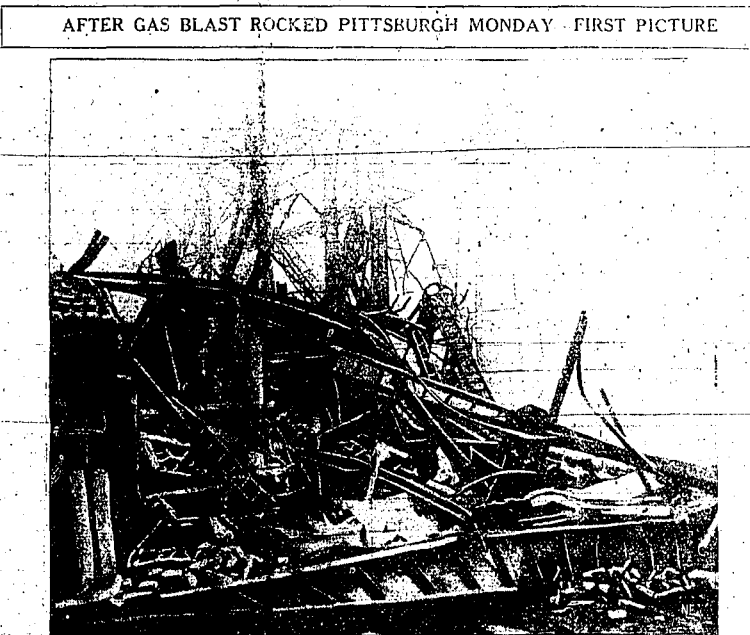

TEX RICKARD ROUSED BY TALK IN KEARNS-DEMPEY COURT ROW

Famous Promoter Admits Making Effort to Have Ex-champ and Manager Patch Up Trouble; Denies Suit Can Injure Boxing Game.
