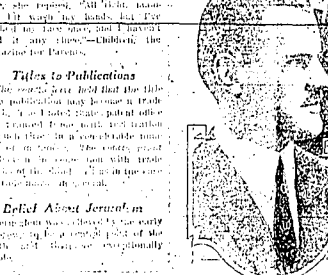

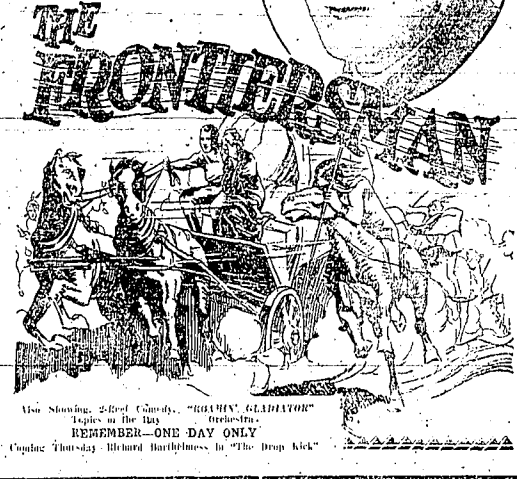

The South Side district contains Twin Falls, Buhl, Chandler, Eden, Elmer, Hawley and Hecton and Kimberly.

Tournament Place Undecided.  
 Each sub-district is to send two boys' teams to the district tournament. These two lives run in chosen in any way that the sub-district officials may choose. The place where the district tournament is to be held will be decided later.

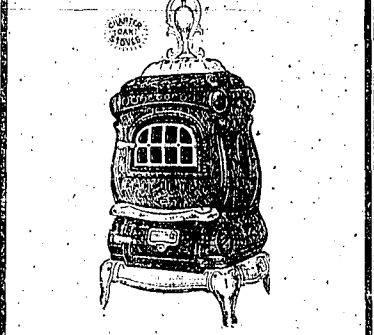
