

Mrs. Snyder and Gray To Die in Chair Jan. 9

Woman Sentenced to Death for Murder of Husband Cries All Night When Informed of Verdict; Lover and Partner in Crime Is Unmoved.

SING SING PRISON, OSSISING, N. Y., Nov. 23 (UP)—Mrs. Josephine Brown died for her daughter, Ruth Brown Snyder, today, a few hours after Mrs. Snyder learned that the work of January 9 she must die in the electric chair.

An Mrs. Brown approached Mrs. Snyder's cell in the death house. Mrs. Snyder stepped forward to meet her. Then she covered her mouth with a handkerchief and gazed wretchedly into her mother's eyes, neither spoke.

OSSISING, N. Y., Nov. 23 (UP)—Ruth Snyder, her face tear-stained and her faded blonde hair, knew today that she must die in the electric chair in the second week of January, unless she escapes the unexpected lull.

Henry Judd Gray, her partner in the murder of her husband, Albert, last year, but he was sentenced and unmoved.

Mrs. Snyder cried most of the night in her cell, which she had shared with Gray. She passed a quiet and restful night.

Both were informed yesterday that the state court of appeals had denied them a new trial and that they would die unless Governor Smith intervenes. Prison officials were informed that the Governor had been set for January 9 by the court in Albany.

Warden Lewis A. Laws said Mrs. Snyder and Gray would not be notified of the date until the day before.

NEW CAR PART FORD DESIGN

Some Secrets Regarding Construction Are Revealed by Newspaper.

HAMMOND, Ind., Nov. 23—Henry Ford, whose original model "T" car was the product of his own hands, has designed part of the new Ford in his private workshop, the Hammond Times said today in a story revealing that the 1938 model is being designed.

The story said enough of the new model would be run off the assembly line to show it to the public. It will be shown in the plant in Dearborn, Mich., on about Dec. 2, when the first official showing will take place in England with the opening of the British automobile show.

The "new" car, the Times continued, is equipped with four-wheel drive, expanding brakes designed by Henry Ford in his private workshop.

The motor, contrary to expectations, is not a small, low, high stroke motor of the type used in the Ford Model T, but is an even larger motor than that of the old model T. It has four cylinders, each of 3 1/2 inches and a stroke of 4 1/2 inches.

With a cubic displacement of approximately 210 cubic inches, the "new" model T, it will have a rating of about 25 horsepower and develop from 40 to 45 horsepower.

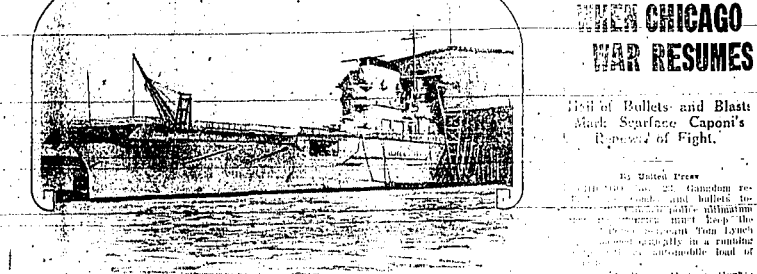

It organizes contests and helps them to improve their local tuberculosis and health problems, organizes campaigns of work and relief for the tuberculous. For needed legislation for the control and cure of tuberculosis, organizes the Christmas Seal Sale and finances the work in the state, safeguards the health of the children by providing public health nurses where there are no school or family nurses, by supplying schools, by establishing nutrition classes and health, drinking campaigns for undernourished children, discovers the early signs of tuberculosis and gives them medical attention; teaches the tuberculous patients to protect the family and public and insure a healthy part in other activities.

The penny Christmas Seal is the chief support of the anti-tuberculosis work. It is sold in every city in Nevada and Idaho, in other popular being made for funds. 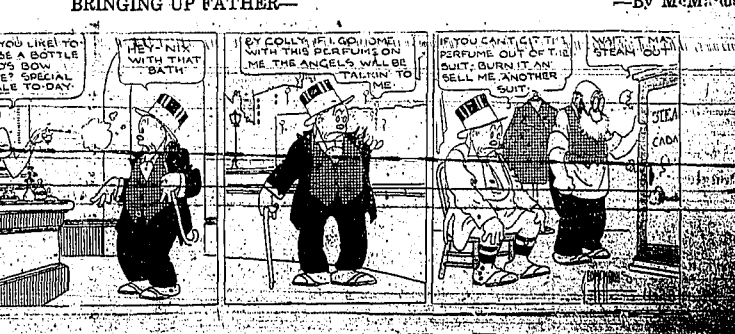
