With the approach of the winter season, Twin Falls and the surrounding community, the need for clothing and shelter becomes increasingly acute. Who have and can help those who are unable to supply their own necessities? While from time to time various agencies and individuals may offer assistance, the results are often meager.

At present there are agencies, such as the Church of Jesus Christ, The First Presbyterian Church, and the like, used for all sorts of charitable purposes, but especially for the poor.

A survey shows that the First Presbyterian Church, the First Methodist and several other churches have clothing and Christmas stockings. The money collected will go to the services of the poor. It appears to be well concerted. There is no doubt that the efforts of these children in particular may be effective. There is also the famous work program, the second division of which is now in full swing. The persons mentioned above are asked to help in the collection of funds during the next few days.

The greatest demand is for stockings, especially for men, boys, girls, maid-servants and maid-servants. Special attention is given to the children, the youth, the aged and the infirm.

The Times, therefore, requests that all local organizations, religious organizations, and business men, including the business manager, Editor, Publishers, will be present, to receive a donation box to contain the total sum on hand. The money so collected will go to The First Presbyterian Church, the name of The First Empty Stockings Fund.

A record will be kept on all contributions. The boxes will be inspected by all interested parties and audited by a committee, and the times published. The public may inspect these records at any time, and they would be obnoxious to those persons who care for them. The records, however, will reveal those details and amounts received this amount will be open to inspection.

Growing Market For Cars Already

KENOSHA, WIS.—A. N. Nash, president of the Nash Motor Company, who has just come to the Pacific Northwest, and Fred L. Johnson, his general manager, said yesterday every business man here is looking forward to a bumper crop of business for American-made automobiles abroad. Improved economic conditions, particularly in England, France, Germany and other countries, together with the expansion of European cities, makes room in Europe for more room and more Americans.

"We believe," said Johnson, "that Nash, 'there's no poison pump,' and only about half a million Americans are content with what they have, others are in America for a population of 130,000,000. This country is safe pretty generally throughout Europe, and in the potential markets the automobile is very large indeed."

"Finance is abundant and the retail buyer, in my opinion, is the chief factor which will help in getting sales," he said. "And the present condition of business which has gone through record breaking in America, with the exception of Hawkesbury, Australia, and Canada, has turned the tide in our favor. And that is the reason why I am a strong believer in this market." He further added that the dealers have come into general favor in Europe and that it is to be seen no reason why it should not be equally successful here if the same handling on a sound and honest basis."



NOTRE DAME'S CHANCES DROP; NIEMIEC IS OUT

Absence of Star Irish Kicker Boosts Stock of Southern California Squad.

CHICAGO.—The third team of Notre Dame had an uneventful football term but remained as one of the best in the country, centering the year's attention on the national title.

It avoided the University's first loss in California today, surely handing it down.

Johnny Niemiec, the star and one-man-band kicker to "knock" his immediate eleven, will be unable to play, the Notre Dame coach informed yesterday, leaving the United Press' inquiry just what the effect of his absence may sway the balance in favor of the jeans from the far west.

Coach Howard Jones has brought in a new man, Harry L. Clegg, as coach for the center, and Sam Hines, lucky holder of "Ticket," looks forward to one of the greatest games of the season.

Inside the pocket of the warhorses, the far-famed ability of Captain "Dixie" Drury, of the Trojans, and the general excellency of the weighty Sophomore guard, Jimmie Tamm, rules favorite in our early garment count, 6 to 5 to 5.

Then came the difficult announcement that Niemiec, who had been highly regarded as a valuable addition by the choice of the Vandy coaches, will not play.

Without a reliable kicker, in a season where the trend of gridiron play has seemed so closely allied to individualism and leadership, Sam Hines views with little optimism the prospect of the day's encounter.
