GERMANY WILL ASK LEAGUE HALT
POLAND-LITHUANIA WAR MENACE

BERLIN, Nov. 25.—Germany, at the meeting of the league of nations council next month, will ask intervention to avoid a threatened outbreak between Poland and Lithuania, the United Press learned today.

The decision followed a meeting between Foreign Minister Stresemann, German ambassador to London, Lord Curzon, Lithuanian minister, Litvinski, and Polish minister, Foch, in London, which was held in the presence of the press.

The German foreign office, it is learned, has received advice from diplomatic representatives of the Polish and Lithuanian capitals that the situation is highly dangerous.
