

Every newspaper of any consequence has carried full page advertisements every day this week and previously there have been weeks and weeks of advertising telling prospective buyers that Mr. Ford would manufacture a new car.

The fact remains, however, that he has advertised, perhaps until it "hurt", and he has obtained results which will many hundred times offset his expenditures.
